Notes.

Crosscut 50' in hard schist to N.+S quartz vein, dipping E in schist. Back stoped and partly underhand stoped for distance of 200 feet, lagged above and inaccessible below. No ore seen underground. Said to have carried lead and gold. A sample of the sorted dump, 1/2 Ton, at mouth of tunnel assayed (H-162 Au. 0.10 oz; Ag. 0.60 oz. No lead or copper observed. 50' above in a cut 30' long showing belt of iron stained silicified schist 4' wide with a little quartz showing iron and manganese stains. Some jasper and iron outcrop. 50' below the main tunnel, is another tunnel, boarded up, which Park says is in about 50'. Schist on dump with very little of anything resembling ore. Unattractive prospect.

On the same side of the gulch and probably on the same zone as the Ajax are three short tunnels on the Good-enough, belonging to the Lawler Estate. They are said to show a little lead and gold. No mineral observed.
