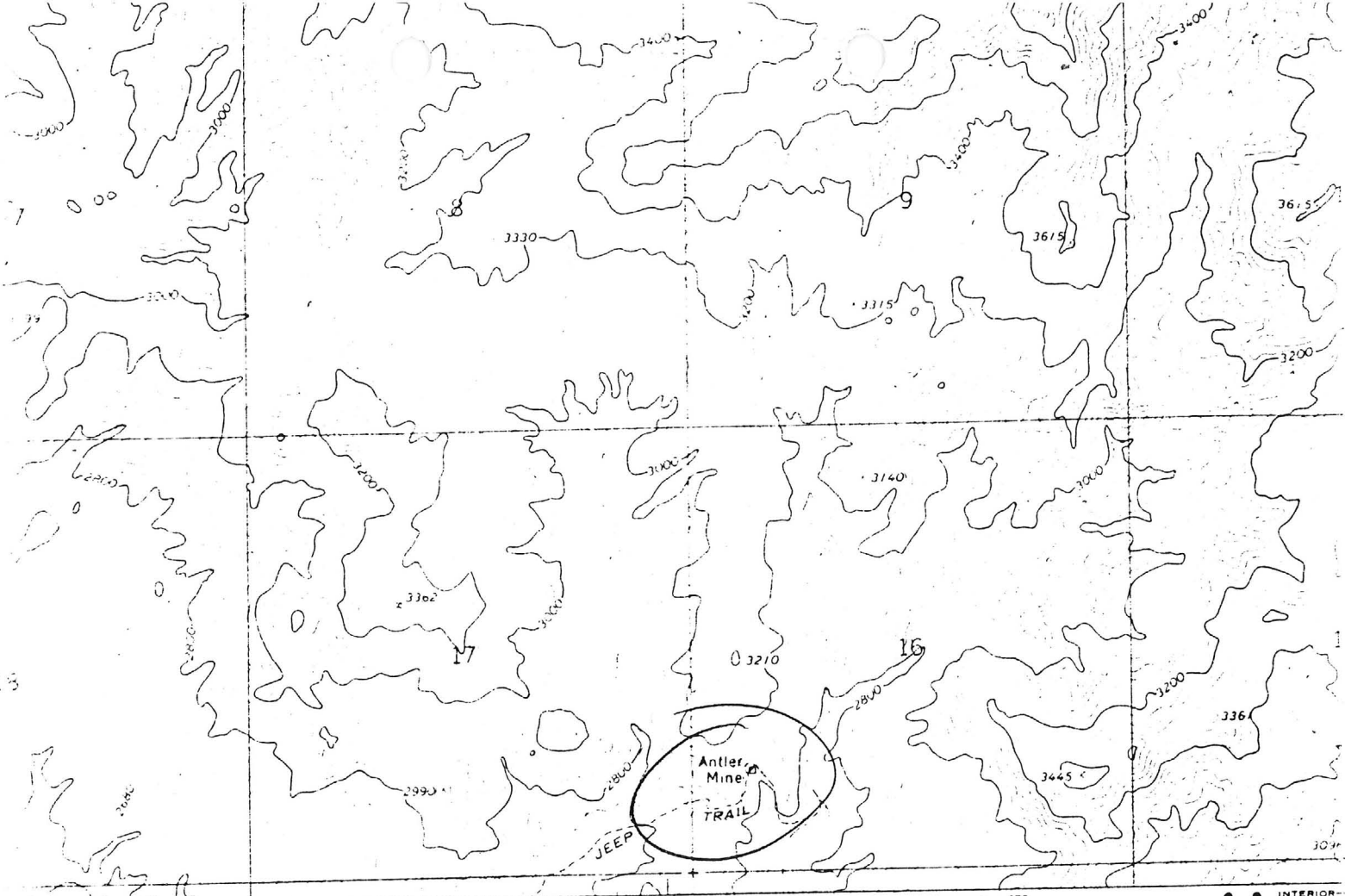

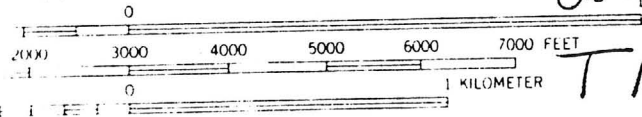

Walt Rogers, Congress said he was buying the Antler Au mine in Sec. 16 T12N R11W from the estates of Dye & Bathrich. GW WR 4/26/76

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Went to Congress where Mr. Rogers said he had been unable to make a deal for the Antlers Au mine of Mrs. Bathrick. GW WR 6/2/76

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Walt Rogers has made no headway in cleaning out the Antler shaft north of the Santa Maria River. GW WR 8/13/76

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Kingman Mining Project 11/3/76, Claim map 5, Underground map 1 p & s

KAP WR 11/27/81: Don Riedel, a consulting geologist made a verbal report on a visit to the Antler patented mine in Sec. 16, T12N, R11W, Artillery Mtns. Dist. (?) Mohave County. The property is a single isolated patented claim with additional unpatented claims. The antler is surveyed as M.S. 1907. The property is difficult to reach. The gold occurrence was prospected-developed by a shaft on the vein and numerous pits and trenches along the vein. The shaft is vertical for 100 feet on the vein, then inclines on the vein; it is apparently in good condition. Riedel reported he walked over 900 feet of vein outcrop. The vein was traced about 400 feet from the shaft to a point where the outcrop was 4' wide with visible gold and limonite after pyrite; 400' further the vein was 16' wide in a granitic rock, and gold was visible in the vein material. At the shaft was small pile of hand sorted "ore" with free gold. Mr. Riedel collected 4 samples across the vein. Ray Wreggit is trying to find a developer for the property.

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TC 1/20/83 to A. Turney: Mr. Hal Perry, Sunstate Contracting Company, 4400 W. Missorie #20, Glendale, Arizona 85301, phone 934-9289 said that their company is interested in purchasing the Antler Gold Mine in Mohave County. He says there is a problem with obtaining clear title to adjoining land which been claimed by a W. A. Hardee, of Congress and a Bonnie Dawson (Via Con Dios #1-6). Apparently Hardee and Dawson sold off small parts of the claims to people.

Mr. Perry said the Antler Patented Claim is owned by the daughter of a Mr. Dye who was owner until he died. He was the owner of Dye Oxygen Company here in Phoenix.

Mr. Perry said that his company is going to "properly sample" the property and if it looks good will purchase it.

He said he would send the department any additional information he finds for our files.

He was also going to contact Don Riedel (see above) to see if he has any information on the mine since he was on the property in 1981 and apparently took some samples.
