




APACHE CLAIMS

Two miles east of Copper Mountain, between Mayer & Stoddard
west?

Machine as far as old Whitney Ranch (now Nell's), then trail. Harvey R. Smith, Humboldt, locator, with whom I visited the Apache and adjoining GRANT claims (now being developed by R. W. Hollis) on February 17th, 1917.

The outstanding features of both groups of claims are the very large and prominent quartzite ledges and the great complexity of the general formation. Volcanic intrusions enclose masses of Yavapai schist, the latter generally much metamorphosed and silicified. The strike of the mineralized zones is generally N-S.

On the Apache No. 3 claim is an outcrop of silicified schist, showing occasional small copper stains on the cleavage planes. The belt is about 300' wide and knife-blade quartz veinlets show throughout. A sample across 20', obtained by breaking chips, assayed (H-29) .10 oz. gold; .88 oz. silver, and .84% copper.

Assessment work is being done in a 10' pit in leached granitic rock, called porphyry. A contact of the "porphyry" with schist a little to the west of the pit shows...

The low gold and silver values indicate that the operators are prospecting for copper, but the man in charge did not appear to know what are the intentions. H. R. Smith informs me that Hollis has paid \$6,000.00 as the first installment of the total purchase price of \$20,000.00, the balance being due in one year's time.
