



Dear Sir:

In support of my application hereto attached I state as follows:

That the Arbitration group of claims contain ores of Zinc and Copper and that during past recent years, I have made nearly 400 linear feet of mine developments underground.

On the 90' level of the shaft sunk on a large gossanized vein, copper ore fully 15 feet wide ranging in grade from 1.5% to 5% copper has been found and that the structural conditions and mineralization, are favorable, to the existence of a commercial body of these copper ores.

I have both the assurance of elderly miners to carry on the work, also mine drilling and hoisting equipment, and if the road is granted, I expect at early date thereafter, to produce crude copper ores.

Other prospects contiguous to this road and the Forest Service will be to some extent, benefitted by this road, as applied for.

The neighboring Carlota mine distant less than 1 mile from my Arbitration shaft, are now and have been for more than a year past, been mining and trucking to the International Smelter at Miami, Arizona, fully 70 tons crude copper ore daily.

Engineers of both the U. S. Bureau of Mines and of the State Department of Mineral Resources, have examined both the Copper shaft also the zinc tunnels and from their statements, along with my personal knowledge of the mineralization within my Arbitration group, I base the above statements.


