Went with John Lemons to his five perlite claims about 20 miles SE of Aguila. The four Beehive claims are end to end and cover 4 ridges of outcropping perlite in Sec. 34, T5N, R8W. The deposits are enechelon to the NW and strike N30°-40°W, no dip could be observed unless its vertical. They are from 250 feet to 400 feet in width and each is at least ½ mile long. The Bernice claim is about 1½ miles NE of the Beehive claims on a northwesterly trending deposit of a similar size as the others but is more gray and coarser grained than the Beehive deposits and, therefore, may be of better quality, however, Mr. Lemons said samples from all the deposits "pop" with equal facility. A composite sample from all the deposits has been submitted to Building Products Company, Phoenix, but as yet they have no commitment.

history of the area:

in 1973 John Lemons submitted a composite sample to Building Products Company of Phoenix. Later in 1973 samples of perlite were sent to the W.R. Grace Company. In 1974 Frank Cartwright of Phoenix examined some of the perlite and reported that the perlite was too hard.

geology of the area:

The property covers four ridges of outcropping perlite. The deposits are enechelon to the NW and strike $N30^{\circ}-40^{\circ}W$. No dip or it may be vertical. The deposits are 250 to 400 feet in width and each is about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile long.
