

LOCATION- In the north half of section 2: R12E; T24S; . This mine is located on the north side of Walker Canyon at an elevation of approximately 4200 feet.

DLAIMS - 4 Status not known. This is the same group of 4 claims that includes the WHITE OAK MINE see report of same date.

OWNER- Mr. W. H. Clarke of Nogales (Ruby Road).

LEESEES - Name not known at present time.

PRESENT ACTIVITY- A little work underground from the adit level had recently been done, and may still be active. Two small portable compressors were near the tunnel portal, probably 300 or 400 cubic feet capacity total. A wheel barrow had been used to tram muck from the adit to the dump.

ORE- Could see nothing of value in the material on the dump, but do not know where the material came from.

MINE WORKINGS - The main adit was all that was visited, it is near the top of the ridge and has been driven northerly to intersect the vein. Vein not examined.
