Hilton Cass, geologist-engineer with the U S. Forest Service reported he visited the property near Tortilla Peak (not far from Tortilla Flats). He explained that a very small quantity of free gold (a few colors) were found in a 2 inch iron stained stringer in a weathered zone in the "C" soil horizion. He collected 4 samples which he had crushed at ADMR. From one sample he recovered a few colors which totalled 0.35 mg gold.

The Forest Service plans to allow Mr. Bilbrey to pursue the occurrence with a small motorized gravity concentrator fed by a hand shovel.
