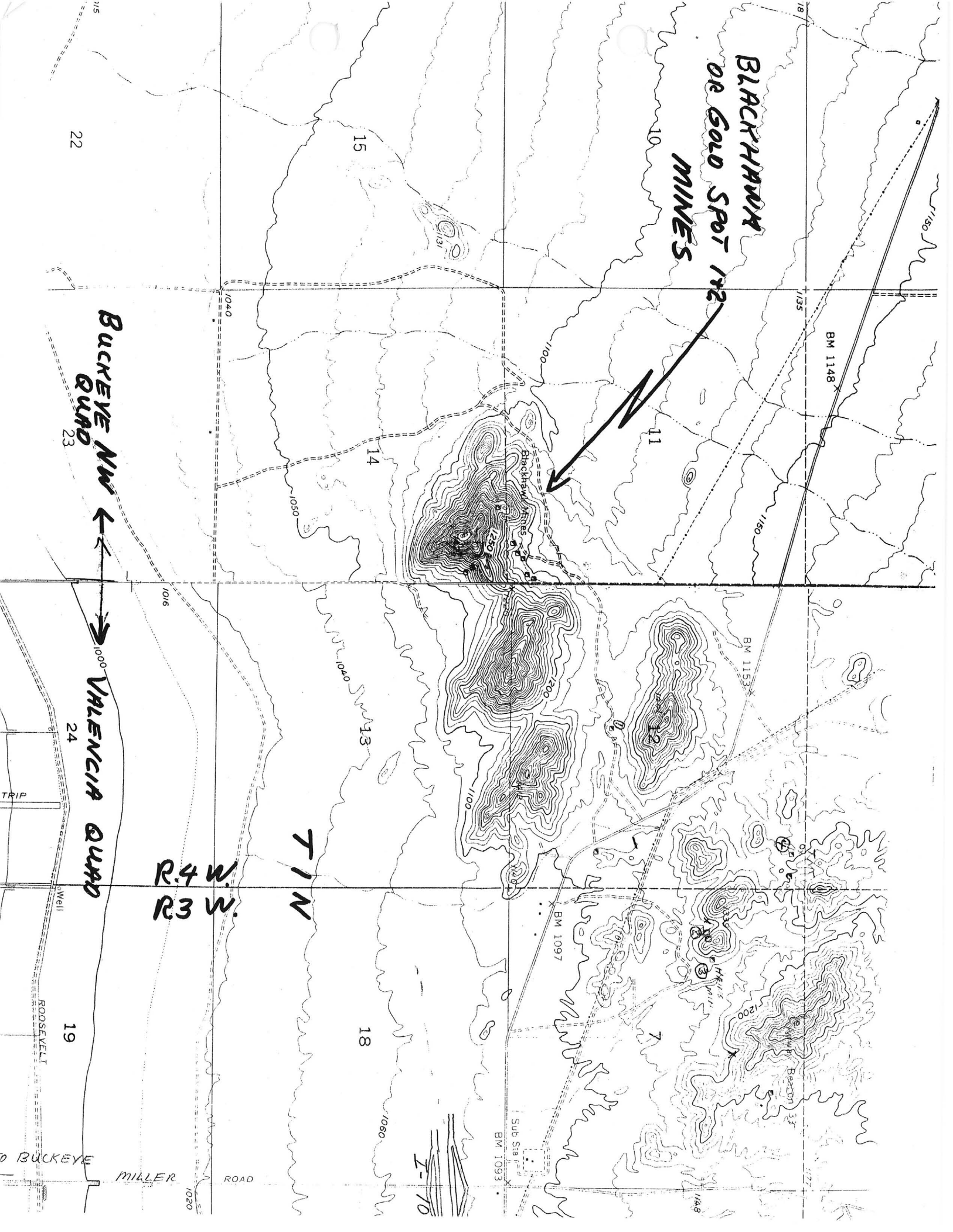

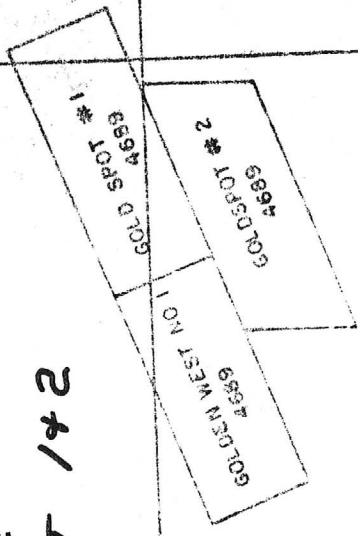

KAP WR 2/3/84: W. G. White reported he plans to have 2 men working next week at the Gold Spot Mine. He plans to start mining by trenching along the vein, first by excavating the barren portion of the "vein" structure, then by slabbing the "pay" rock in the trench and removing it to a stockpile for shipment to either Archie Stutenroth's mill or to a gravity mill he plans to erect. A visit was made to the property earlier in the week with Mr. White and a report was written for the Gold Spot No. 1 and 2 Mine. The mine is generally known as the Blackhawk. Globe Resources, P.O. Box 7587, Amarillo, Texas 79109 has/had a group of claims in the area of which the Gold Spot #1, Goldspot #2 and Golden West No. 1 are subleased to W. G. White and Joe Johnson through Jarrett J. Ransom, 2713 Pawnee Drive, Amarillo, Texas 79109 and associates Mark H. Sepelton, 750 Tabot Street, Golden Colorado 80401 and John L. Griffin, 314 Drakestone Drive, Colorado Springs, Colo. 80909. Mr. White had previously worked the property in the 1970's.

KAP WR 2/24/84: A visit was made to the Gold Spot Mine, Maricopa County. W. G. White was supposed to have begun a sampling and pilot gravity mill project on the property. No work had been started.

KAP WR 3/2/84: Mr. "Dub" White reports he is still involved in obtaining equipment for a pilot mill at the Gold Spot Mine, Maricopa County. No new excavation work has been done.

GW/WR 5/6/76 - Mr. Beinfang had results of 3 samples taken from W.G. White's lease 7 miles NE of Buckeye one of which indicated 20.99 oz. Au/ton another went 0.85 oz/ton. George Beinfang will take a few more samples near the high one before investing in the property.

GW/WR 5/24/79 - Mr. White, Buckeye, called to say he is starting his Au lease 7 miles north of Buckeye and that William Dean is selling his mill in Blind Indian Creek; he will try to buy it.

GW/WR 8/5/79 - Went to Mr. White's Gold Spot Mine about 5 1/2 miles NW of Buckeye where he has rigged up a small mill consisting of a 6"x9" jaw crusher, and 8"x8" homemade set of rolls, a 2' diameter x 3 1/2 ft. ball mill and about 15 ft. of sluice box 8" wide with carpet in the bottom and steel riffles 1" high and 6" apart. Neither the mine or mill were in operation as they were extending the rails and ladders in the 30 ft. inclined shaft. The vein has widened from 6" to 13" and concentrates made from a recent mill run pan a lot of Au; a guess would be several oz/ton. He had one assay about 8 ft. above the present face that went 20.9 oz/ton.

KAP WR 10/9/79 - Mr. W. S. "Dub" White reported he is drilling on his gold claims north of Buckeye (possibly the Gold Spot Mine).

KAP 10/12/79 - Mr. W. S. "Dub" White reported that assays of drill cuttings from drilling his gold property north of Buckeye (Gold Spot?) ran 0.02 tr/oz/ton in gold.

KAP WR 11/18/83: Mr. W. G. "Dub" White reported he is again investigating the GoldSpot #1 & #2, Osborn District, Maricopa County.

Mr. West stated that he purchased Gold Spot No. 1 and No. 2 from Mr. Charles Murphy in October 1968. He formed a Texas corporation known as Globe Resources Inc. He retained 40% of the stock. Eight others owned 60%. Mr. West's present home address is 913 Austin Street, Amarillo, Texas 79102.

The company address is 2801 West Hover Circle, Amarillo, Texas 79109 (also office address of ^{George} D. ~~Dob~~ervick and Taylor, consulting geologist). Mr. ~~Dob~~ervick is present president of Globe Resources Inc.

The mine is located in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 11, T1N, R4W (see map). There are old shafts on the property.

A Mr. White had the mine leased for a short time in 1979. At this time Mr. West is working with a Mr. Lloyd Short, Desert Cyprus Trailer Park, Space 14, Wickenburg. They are going to try a cyanide operation.

Near their mine, east, in section 7 of T1N, R3W is two shafts on the same quartz vein called Haines Mine in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and Golden Eagle in W $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$. According to Mr. West, the Haines' mined, hauled the ore to their arrastra in Palo Verde with values to \$800 per ton. Water in the mine and problems with amalgamation closed the mine. It worked from 1885 to 1893.

W. B. West of Amarillo, Texas, who spends about half of his time in Arizona, phoned re abandoned gold mines in T1N, R3 and 4W, or 4-5 miles north then 2 mines west from Buckeye. Old timers tell old hearsay stories of high grade ores, for instance, "The deepest shaft was 700 feet to water with ores \$760 to \$1,000 per ton in fissure vein. Men 70-75 years old tell of granddads working at the mines. West says there are a number of shafts in the area, all in good condition, in granite or gneiss. After dropping rocks he estimates depths at 60 to a few hundred feet or more.

West is in the investment business. Four directors, also principal stockholders and friends are in with him on this project/ They have property running about 3 miles SW-NE? and he remarked that the Yuma road crosses it. He says they have the gold values and have applied for an OME loan. The gold is in hematite replacing quartz and some ore is plainly rich. He is now busy getting bids for diamond drilling and other exploration work. He commented "There is no ore in the dumps but you find it scattered in the workings.

West has had the Arizona Bureau of Mines search for information with help from the library. There is an old USGS topographical map showing a Black Hawk and a Haines mine. He said he had some evidence of cyaniding at the Haines.

We have nothing on the mines of the area except the topo maps.

Mr. W. G. White reported he had run a small gravity mill on the property in 1979. He feels the selectively mined ore will average 1.5 tr. oz Au/ton based on his previous work. He plans to begin trenching along the vein to produce numerous bulk samples for a pilot run.
