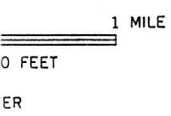

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BLUE KEY BERYL

MOHAVE COUNTY

NJN WR 7/27/84: Henry Gonzales (card) reported a beryl occurrence near the Golden Key Mine, Mohave County. This occurrence, the Blue Key Beryl, is located in T14N R11W Sec 27 NE. It is accessed by a "hand made road" which is not shown on the topo map. Where the road forks, one fork goes to the Golden Key Mine, the other fork goes to the beryl deposit. The deposit is described as having a large quartz core and blue-green beryl crystals up to 4" in diameter and up to one foot long.

NJN WR 1/4/85: While in the area of the Golden Keys Mine some effort was made to locate the Blue Key Beryl. Numerous pegmatites were seen. They were generally less than 2' wide and 30' long. Some showed slight zoning. More effort needs to be made to examine the pegmatites in the area and chase jeep trails. Aerial reconnaissance to plot the location of pegmatites would also be useful.
