- A. C. Bourbannais reported that James E. Hamblin, representing the Texas and Oklahoma Co. (Union Sulphur) reportedly a subsidiary of the Union Carbide, were drilling at the Idazona Group, formerly partly owned by Bourbannais. Hamblin had an office at 3215, 61 E. Valencia Drive, Phoenix 276-3215 LAS WR 3-17-67
- A. C. Bourbannais, Alray Mining Company (consisting of him, E. R. Dees and J. A. Craddock, 264-5911) was in and brought in a 60-claim map that was recently surveyed by Richard Mieritz, consultant. The claims are unpatented and contain lead, silver and copper values. See Comeback Claims (file) LAS WR 3-24-67
- Mr. A. C. Bourbannais reported that Freeport Sulphur were on his claims near Morristown (4 miles west on the west branch of the Hassayampa River) The same group are planning to do some drilling at the Idazona claims, Webb District, southwest of Buckeye. LAS WR 4-21-67

Property: 26 claims - unpatented but all work done.

Geology: The property covers a group of low-relief hills composed mostly of chlorite schist, of Pre-cambrian age. The schist has been intruded by diorite and andesite porphyry. Numerous quartz veins, accompanied by limonitic borders, carry values in gold and silver. Two of the most persistent veins show some good copper and lead veins in depth. Barite accompanies one of these veins. The numerous, narrow veins are parallel and strike N 30° E. two main veins strike nearly N-S and the dip varies on both sides of vertical at steep angles. The schist trends N 45° W and dips at a fairly steep angle to the SW. Some of the narrow veins run up to \$2000 per ton and much of the material carries 2-3 ounces of gold. Silver values are good.

Development: Three shafts from 35' to 165' in depth have been sunk, in addition to considerable trenching. No development work had been done on the barite. Some excellent cutting chrysocolla was disclosed in the deep shaft in the southwest portion of the property.
