SANTA CRUZ COUNTY

MG WR 11/11/83: Visited the Brick Mine. Mr. Jim "Jettaway" Knight is caretaker. He is keeping the mine pumps operational.

MG WR 8/16/85: Visited the Brick mine (Santa Cruz Co.) It appears that all equipment except a large trailer has been removed. There is no activity at the property.

HEM WR 4/29/88: Charles Porter (card) has listed for sale the Brick Mine (file) Santa Cruz County. The mine is currently inactive.

BRICK MINE

SANTA CRUZ COUNTY

MG WR 12/31/82: Visited the Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County. Mr. Duane Arnold the Mine Engineer, took me through the mine. The decline has been connected on the 100-level to the old workings on the west and east sides. Approximately 1300 feet of new workings have been driven. There has been no exploration drilling by the operator, Ord Silver Mining Co. Apparently Cimetta Engineering and Construction Co., Tucson, is a consultant on the property; reportedly Cimetta is doing mill feasibility tests.

MG 3/4/83: Re: The Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County. This property, controlled by Arivaca Silver Mines Ltd. and operated by Ord Silver Mines, Inc., has apparently been purchased from Mr. Charles Hagerty. Arivaca Silver Mines Ltd. is reportedly a member of Four Star Group, Mr. B. L. Williams, President, 210-700 W. Pender St., Vancouver, B. C. V6C 1G8, Canada, phone (604)669-4637.

MG WR 5/13/83: Development work was temporarily stopped in mid-April at the Brick Mine. It is reported that Ord Silver Mines had Venture Drilling rotary drill approximately 700 feet on the Brick property in late April. Heinrichs Geoexploration apparently ran an IP survey during early May.

MG WR 6/10/83: Have heard rumors that Ord Silver Mines, Inc., has discovered 10,000 tons, averaging 10 oz/t silver, at the Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County. No decision to mine this deposit has been made. Exploration rotary holes are still being drilled from the surface.

NJN WR 6/17/83: With Mike Greeley visits were made to the St. Patrick, St. Christopher and San Francisco Mines. Mike will write reports with the details for these visits. Also visited were the Brick Mine where evidence indicated recent drilling activity, and the Choctaw, Austerlitz, Idaho and Montana Mines. No activity was observed at these last four mines. All of the above mines are located in Santa Cruz County or Pima County.

MG WR 7/8/83: The Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County has been shut down. Mr. Duane Arnold, the mine engineer who has been laid off, told me the mine pumps are still in operation. Approximately 22 rotary holes, averaging 300 feet each, were drilled from the surface on the property. The exact location of the 10,000 ton ore reserve, blocked out by Mr. Arnold, is unclear to me but I think it is in the main vein, adjacent and west of the old workings. Apparently no additional ore was found as a result of the surface drilling.

BRICK MINE

SANTA CRUZ COUNTY

MG WR 4/28/82: Drove by the Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County, but was unable to visit. A sign states that the Operator of the mine is Ord Silver Mines, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Arivaca Silver Mines Ltd. It is reported that a 720 to 750 ft. decline (?) is being driven on the property.

MG WR 6/4/82: According to Mr. John Taylor of the AZ Mine Inspector's office, there are 9 men employed at the Brick mine. Two shifts work five day/week. The mine portal is west of the old Brick workings. Mr. Taylor reports that the parent company, Arivaca Silver Mines Ltd., is listed on the Vancouver, B.C., Canada, stock exchange.

Mr. George Ryberg, District Geologist, B & B Mining Company reports that a company named Pacific Resources did some exploration work at the Brick Mine several years ago. The exploration program included both core and rotary drilling. Some drill intercepts reportedly ran 22 oz Ag/ton.

MG WR 7/30/82: Mr. John Taylor of the State Mine Inspectors office reports that a Mr. B. Williams is manager of the Ord Silver Mining Co., 1325 E. Lemon St., Tempe, AZ 85281, phone 768-4002. This company operates the Brick Mine in Santa Cruz County.

MG WR 9/3/82: Provided file information on the Brick mine, Santa Cruz County to Mr. Bob Crist of ASARCO, Tucson. The brick mine management has inquired about selling ore to ASARCO.

MG WR 9/17/82: Contacted Mr. Ed Grasmoe, 2009 Estrella Rd., Prescott, Az 86301, phone 445-4478. He sent me some assay reports and a smelter report on ore that he and his brother mined in 1976 at the Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County. I copied the Phoenix office with this information.

MG WR 9/24/82: U.S. Bureau of Mines Reported production from Oro Blanco Mining District, Santa Cruz County. The Brick mine, operated in 1939-44, 1966 and 1976 produced 4,103 Tons of ore which treated produced 23,424 pounds of copper; 277 pounds of lead, 69,317 ounces of silver and 356 ounces of gold.

I drove to the Brick mine where I picked up Ed Grasmoe. We drove about 3/4 mile south of the Brick to a claim which Grasmoe recently located. We mucked out a caved portal to an adit and then examined the workings. I cut two samples which Grasmoe will assay. There are traces of lead and zinc minerals associated with two faults. It is believed that the ores do not contain sufficient grade to ship to the Tonto mill. VBD WR 4/16/76

GWI phone call 5/25/73:

He said that the Brick and Montana are close together, but actually aren't the same thing. Mrs. Hugo Miller has kept up the Brick up until last year when someone jumped the claim.

B&B Mining Company has optioned the Brick mine in the Oro Blanco Mining District, Santa Cruz County. VBD WR 6/9/76

Mark V Mines Ltd. (Steve Radvak), 3161 Westmount Place, Vancouver, B.C., has purchased the Brick Mine from the Grasmoe Brothers and adjoining claims from Chuck Haggerty of Arivaca. The Canadian firm has said that they will start a drilling project soon. VBD WR 8/13/76

MG WR 11/27/79: Was informed at this meeting that a Mr. Chick Haggerty sold (or optioned?) his Brick gold-silver property, located near Ruby (Santa Cruz Co.), Arizona, to Noranda. Noranda apparently completed a drilling program there 15 to 18 months ago.

MG WR 11/28/80: Visited the Brick Mine. A separate report will be written.

KAP WR 4/16/82: During a field interview, Dick Beard and myself were shown a letter from Arivaca Silver Mines Ltd. The firm is reported (in the letter) to have commenced work on the Brick Mine, Santa Cruz County, on March 23, 1982. Pertinent people and addresses mentioned in the letter are: Arivaca Silver Mines Ltd. #1908-1450 W. Georgia St., Vancouver, B.C. V6G 2T8. Mr. B. L. Williams, President, Santa Rita Mining Co., Ltd., (same address); Steve Radvak (Radavak), President, Mr. John Rud, Project Mgr. and Geologist.

Mine visit - Brick mine. GWI WR 5-10-71

Mr. Pierson, Day Mines Company, Wallace, Idaho called regarding the Brick mine. The best information we had was given plus a letter containing copies of reports. GW WR 6-11-73

Called Vernon Dale regarding ownership of the Brick mine in Santa Cruz County. He said E.B. Grasmoe, 2009 Estrella Road, Prescott, was the owner. He thinks this is a good property. GW WR 6/11/73

Grasmoe Brothers continue to open up the old Brick shaft in the Oro Blanco district. The air shaft has been completed and a new headframe is nearly completed on the main shaft. I contributed a good Shiv wheel to the operation. VBD WR 7/17/75

I met with Maurice Hedderman at his home in Amado, then drove him to the Brick claim near Ruby, Arizona. VBD WR 8/6/75

I drove to the Brick mine. The Grasmoe Brothers have delivered samples to the Inspiration smelter and to Tonto Mining and Milling Company. VBD WR 9/9/75

Ed Grasmoe called to advise that Asarco would accept two carloads of ore from the Brick mine. He will use the Esperanza railroad loading ramp presently under lease to Jack Hamilton by Duval Corp. VBD WR 1/12/76

I drove to the Brick claim one mile west of Ruby. The Grasmoe Brothers have shipped, on a test basis, two carloads of ore to the Asarco copper smelter at El Paso to be used as flux. Results and smelter returns were not known. Freight charges from the Esperanza siding near Continental to El Paso amounted to \$895. I suggested if shipments are finally made on a regular schedule, that the brothers investigate the purchase of a truck and trailer to haul 40 tons per trip to El Paso and stop supporting Southern Pacific. The Grasmoe brothers donated an old compressor made from a Ford Model A engine to the Dept. VBD WR 1/29/76

Drove to Grasmoe's Brick mine. They do not want any publication about their mine at the present time. B&B Mining is sampling and geologizing the Brick property at the present time. VBD WR 2/13/76

I drove to the Brick mine near Ruby, Arizona, where I assisted and advised Al & Ed Grasmoe in locating 2 millsites south of Ruby for mill water supply. VBD WR 3/1/76

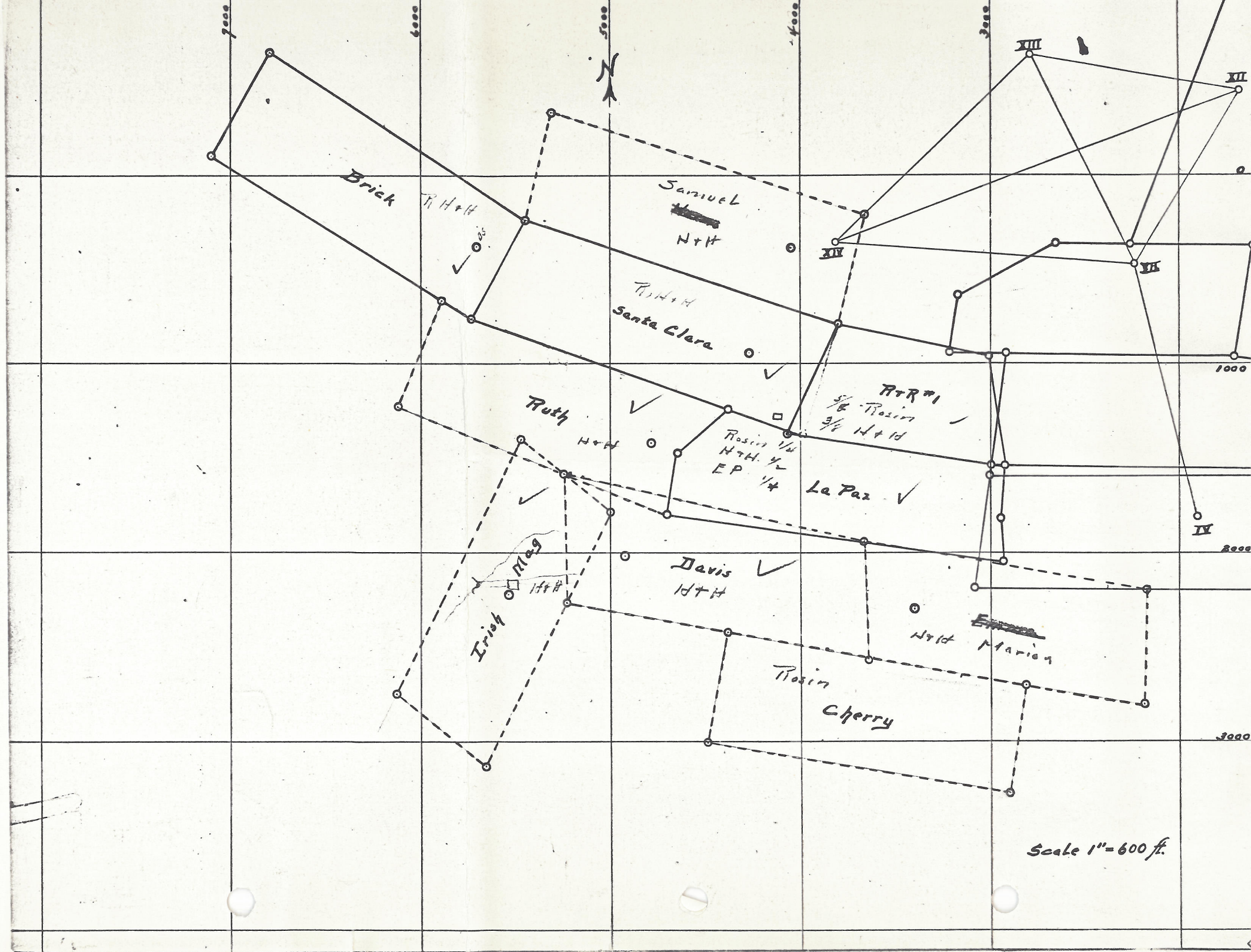
