

Dear Mr. Neese:

I have your letter of the 13th enclosing your Mine Owner's Report on your manganese property. We are pleased to destroy the former report that you sent and put in this later statement.

You mention on it that an inspection has been made by a government engineer and the report is held as confidential by the same. Do you mean that the government engineer did not give you a report on the property? If that is so, then you did not get something that is coming to you. The reports made by the U. S. Bureau of Mines are available to the owner who can do whatever he pleases with them. They are only confidential insofar as the Bureau of Mines is concerned and if you have a copy of such a report, it would be extremely valuable to attach to your statement. There is very little in your statement which would induce a person seeking a manganese property to look into it further, but if you have more reports available it would help a great deal.

The Department of Mineral Resources is getting into action again and the field engineers start out on their work next week. George A. Ballam will be field engineer for your district, but your mine is at Bowie which comes into the district of Fred Porkins, who has headquarters at Globe.
