Subject: Interview with C. E. Toot of Tonto Basin.

Location: The deposit covers a few square miles around Tonto Basin (T 6 N, R 10 E, approximately Secs. 10-11, 14-15 and 22,23.)

Work: A 60 foot shaft shows fine bedded and variable colored clay beds. A few hundred pounds were tested and found to be suitable for structural purposes. Mr. Toot said he was collecting a general sample for further testing.

Geology: The clays are in the upper portion of the Pleistocene (?) lake deposits, which extend over many square miles between Tonto Basin and Roosevelt Lake.
