Subject: Mine Report----- Personal Visit

Location 43 miles south-west of Casa Grande. Go south for 38 miles on the Casa Grande- Quijotoa Road. Then turn west and go 5 miles west. (First 38 miles is good graveled county road, and the last 5 miles is dirt road in fair condition). Then walk for 3/4 mile on a trail up a steep hill to the mining claims, and deposit.

Number of Claims 2 unpatented claims. These claims were located by the present owners in Oct. 1951, and recorded in Jan. 1952. Mr. Davis states that, as yet, they have not furnished the Supt. of the Papago Indian Reservation at Sells a copy of the location, ~~or~~ made the annual payment of 5 cents per acre. He states that they will attend to this very shortly.

Metals Present Copper ore in narrow vein, ore being in form of copper silicates and copper carbonates----- chrysocolla, malachite, with a small amount of cuprite.

Men Employed None. Mine is idle.

Milling Facilities None.

Geology Mineralized quartz vein in granite. Both hanging wall and footwall is granite. Quartz vein is narrow, being from 6 inches to 10 inches wide, nearly vert.

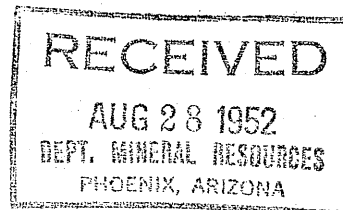
Ore Values The ore values are found in a quartz vein, and is very spotty, that is, in some places in the vein, there is good concentration of ore values, and, in other places in the vein, there is very little showing of ore. Mr. Davis reports samples taken by him, which runs all the way from 11.20 % to 32.10 % of Copper, with a small amount of Silver and Gold values also present. Apparently, these samples do not represent an average ore value on any of the open cuts on the property.

While there, I took a composite sample of the ore bearing vein material in the tunnel and the four open cuts opened up on the property. Following is the analysis of this composite sample, which, I believe, is fairly representative of the vein material on the property:--- Copper--- 3.81 %; Silver--- 0.8 oz.; Gold--- 0.01 oz. (Enclosed find copy of assay).

Dear Roger:

I sent in a report on this property, Copper Ribbon, on Nov. 2, 1951, from information furnished to me by Mr. William C. Davis. I believe this first report should be taken out of the files and destroyed, on account of being inaccurate and misleading.

At the same time, on Nov. 2, 1951, I sent in a report on another of W. C. Davis' properties, the Country Boy. I did not visit this property on my ~~trip~~ trip out there, although it is only 1 3/4 miles from the Copper Ribbon. Mr. Davis did not seem to be concerned about this property, and did not ask me to look at it. I do not believe that Mr. Davis intends to keep up the assessment work on the Country Boy. On account of apparent inaccuracies in Geology and Ore Values in the report of the Country Boy (made from information by W. C. Davis), I believe, that this report should also be taken out of the files and done away with.
