

REFERENCE: See report of September 19, 1979, on CROWNED KING mine.

PRESENT
ACTIVITIES: Mr. Warsing and sons have mucked out the caved portal of the drift (adit) approximately 250 feet north of the south end of the property.

ADIT: The drift (adit) runs 62 feet from cleaned out portal to the face S 20° W. The vein (east most vein) is exposed along the back and varies in width from 48" to 2" and dips 76° W. Quartz, gouge clay, orange limonite and red limonite are visible the length of the vein.

SAMPLES: Sample #2 was taken across 28" of the most mineralized cross section of the vein in a trench 2 feet deeper at the same trench as Sample #1. The bottom of the trench at the time the Sample (#2) was taken was 4" above the back of the drift. During efforts to deepen the trench the drift was broken into.

HISTORY: The history of the Crowned King patented mine is essentially that of the Crown King mines group as given in the above references. The claim lays to the north of the Golden Crown, Silver King and Buckeye patented mines from which the majority of the production of the Crown King mines group was likely taken. The Crowned King patent appears to never have produced ore. The present owner purchased the patent from the owner of the Crown King mines group.

DEVELOPMENT: The Crowned King patent was originally developed by a drift, a shaft and numerous superficial pits along surface outcrops of the veins.

The portal of the drift (adit) is approximately 250 feet north of the south end of the claim along the centerline. It reportedly extends 100 feet to the south. Caving at the portal has nearly removed any sign of the diggings and the small dump was mostly washed down hill and overgrown. The shaft is located on the centerline of the claim approximately 700 feet north of the south end line. The shaft is 80 feet deep, inclined 80° W., with water standing 18 feet below the collar.

GEOLOGY: The geology, climatic setting and district are aptly described in the above references to the Crown King mine.

VEINS: The mineralization appears to be confined to three nearly parallel veins which are probably fracture fissure fillings in altered Yavapai schist. The east most vein appear to be a northern extension of the Crown King vein. The drift and shaft are on the east most vein which generally follows the centerline of the claim. They strike N 30° W and are nearly vertically to dipping 80° W.

The west vein is approximately 150 feet west of the centerline (east vein) and the third vein runs between the two about 50 feet east of the west most vein. The east vein varies from 36" to 2" in width and where exposed averages 20". The other veins are somewhat less prominent and narrower. Minerals identifiable in a hand specimen are limonite (red, yellow and fluffy), quartz, pyrite and small amounts of galena.


SAMPLES: A single sample (#1) was taken in a trench across the vein at the caved portal of the drift above the back. The sample consisted of a 5'6" long channel 3" wide and 2" deep. It includes the vein proper and some of the altered weathered limonite stained wall rock. The contact between vein and wall rock was vague.

COMMENTS: Work on the property prior to purchase by the Warsings had consisted of turn-of-the-century exploration. Shallow sample pits, now nearly filled, are in evidence at numerous places along the strike of all three veins.

Typically such early explorations followed the procedure of digging shallow trenches or pits on the vein, collecting samples from the vein, crushing the sample and panning them for gold (free milling coarse gold). If one or two good outcrops are found by such panning, a small drift or shaft is often started. If good free gold is found in the shaft or drift, it is typically removed by gophering along the vein. Although a shaft was sunk and a drift driven on the property (likely on spots which panned out good) no gophering or stoping was done.

RECOMMENDATIONS: The property should be sampled and the samples assayed for gold, silver, copper, lead and zinc. The early days sampling was most likely only for free gold. The drift should be opened and sampled.


