Property: 2 unpatented claims. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Vicksburg, S.W. along old Parker Road on West side of the Santa Fe. R.R.

~~Property: Cino Property, near Salome, Arizona~~

Optioned by: A. C. Blucker and G. K. Ordway, Rt. 1, Box 49, Salome, Arizona.

Location: SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 27, T. 5 N., R. 14 W.

Minerals: Pb, Cu, with gold and silver.

Work: An open cut 18 feet down-dip is 8 feet wide. The vein has a flat 8° tilt and the hanging wall has the best ore streak (8 inches). The footwall portion or the remainder of the vein is 4 feet thick and much lower grade.

Geology: The course of the vein is not definite but has quartz diorite walls that are somewhat altered. The mineralized zone is possibly a flat nominal fault. The higher grade ore shows up to 56% Pb and 5-6 oz. Ag to the ton. This is said to be in the hanging wall streak. (Taken from assay sheets)
