Claims:

6 Double Bald Eagle - unpatented

Minerals: Cu, Ag, Au, Te (calaverite) Pb, Zn

Work:

3 100 foot diamond drill holes.

Several cuts and shallow shafts (30 feet deepest).

Geology: The main country rock is granite cut by numerous veinlets and 2 main veins. The gangue is largely barite. The veins strike NE-SW and dip to the northwest at variably steep angles. The drill holes disclosed a 12 foot vein which carries copper, gold and silver in variable amounts. Some narrow stringers contain chalcocite up to 60%. Others show a little calavarite (Au, Te) but only as a mineralogical curiosity. (Small pockets of this carry up to 6-7 ounces of gold.) The principal sulphide minerals are chalcocite and chalcopyrite, galena and sphalerite. The principal lead minerals are cerussite, anglesite and galena in this order and these appears to be later than the copper. The principal copper oxide mineral is chrysocolla which occurs with limonite.

History: The claims have been sporadically worked since 1865. The present owners have held them for several years. The assessment work is up to date.
