MG WR 2/1/85: Visited the Fair Play patented claim (Pima County) with Mr. Meryl Hill, Deputy of the Pima County Sheriff's Department. The Fair Play is owned by Mr. Hack Townsend, P. O. Box 87, Arivaca, Arizona 85601. Mr. Hill was investigating a complaint that the operators, Cruz Silver Mines Inc., at the nearby Long Shot mine (Pima County) had beaten a road across one corner of the Fair Play and had stolen approximately 40 tons of gold-bearing ore from a dump near a mine shaft. Mr. Danny A. Culling, Townsend's son-in-law, took us to the site where the rock was removed. Later we went to the Long Shot mine and identified a pile of rock said to have been taken from the "vicinity" of the Fair Play. I estimate this pile may contain 10 tons of rock.

Subject: Field Engineers Report. Information from Hack Townsend.

References: Reports of March 7, 1962 & January 3, 1962.

Present Mining Activity: The mining operations were closed down about July 1st. The owner, Hack Townsend, says that he will let it rest for a while.

Review of Past Operations: The mine was operated part time during the spring of this past year up until closing. The vertical shaft was sunk to a depth of 46 ft. after which a drift was driven on the 46 ft. level following the ore vein. Mr. Townsend reports the ore vein was vertical and was 10 inches wide on the 46 ft. level. On June 22nd a shipment consisting of 41.39 tons of ore was shipped to the A.S. & R. smelter at El Paso. Mr. Townsend reports that the ore in the shipment averaged 4.75% copper, approximately 7% lead, about 7 ounces of silver and 0.42 ounces of gold.

Mr. Hack Townsend is thinking of sinking a new shaft at his Fairplay Mine. (Old one caved or in bad shape). Showed large chunk of ore than ran \$250 in Ag, Pb, Cu.

He said that he is giving the mine a rest now, and has not worked it for the last 1 1/2 months.

| I ARRIVED IN ARIVACA AT APPROX 1648, 1-22-85, & CONTACTED THE RP1, DANNY CULLING. CULLING SAID THAT THE PEOPLE THAT RAN THE LONG SHOT MINE HAD TRESPASSED ON HIS FATHER-IN-LAW'S (V1, HACK TOWNSEND) CLAIM AND HAD ALSO TAKEN APPROX 40 TONS OF ORE FROM IN FRONT OF THE MINE SHAFT. CULLING ALSO STATED THAT TOWNSEND HAD BEEN SELLING THE ORE, AROUND 25 YEARS AGO, FOR \$250.00 PER TON, MAKING THE LOSS OF ORE IN THE AMOUNT OF APPROX \$10,000.00. IN ADDITION THE MINING COMPANY HAD BEATEN A NEW ROAD ACROSS THE PATENTED CLAIM WITH THEIR MACHINERY. CULLING SAID THAT THE PATENTED CLAIM LAY ACROSS THE WASH & THAT TOWNSEND ALSO HAD A REGULAR CLAIM ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE WASH. CULLING SHOWED ME A MAP & TAX RECEIPTS FOR THE PATENTED CLAIM. I FOLLOWED CULLING TO THE CLAIMS SOUTH WEST OF ARIVACA. UPON ARRIVAL, I NOTICED THERE WAS A FAIRLY RECENT ROAD OR TRAIL THAT HAD BEEN BEATEN DOWN BY SOME SORT-OF LARGE MACHINERY. I HAD BEEN IN THIS AREA WITHIN THE LAST 6-12 MONTHS AND HADN'T NOTICED THIS ROAD OR TRAIL AT THAT TIME. THE TRACKS APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN MADE BY SOME LARGE RUBBER TIRE WITH A LUG TYPE TREAD ON IT. IT APPEARED THAT THE TRACKS WERE RECENT AS THE TRACKS WERE STILL DISTINCT. IT HAD RAINED IN THAT AREA APPROX 1-1½ WEEKS AGO. CULLING SAID THAT HE HAD TOLD THE PEOPLE AT THE LONG SHOT, APPROX 3 MONTHS AGO TO STAY OFF OF TOWNSEND'S CLAIMS. I THEN TALKED TO TERRY VIERRA WHO LIVES ON A CLAIM KNOWN AS THE EDWARDS MINE APPROX 200 YARDS EAST OF TOWNSEND'S PATENTED CLAIM. HE SAID THAT HE WORKS FOR THE NJB MINING COMPANY, TUCSON, AZ. THE NJB IS CURRENTLY WORKING THE LONG SHOT, WHICH IS ACROSS THE MOUNTAIN TO THE NORTH EAST. HE SAID THAT NORM BELLAMIER (PHONE 323-9369) IS THE OVERSEER OF THE OPERATION AT THE LONG SHOT FOR THE NJB MINING CO. Number of Claims 1 patented claim. This is a fractional claim containing 14.37 acres.

Owner Hack Townsend, Arivaca

Operator Same as above.

Principal Minerals lead, copper, silver, gold.

Present Mining Activity Drifting west from the bottom of a 30 ft. vertical shaft. 2 men working part time.

Ore Values Hack Townsend reported that a recent sample showed following:
Copper -- 9 %; Lead -- 17 %; Silver -- 18.5 oz.; Gold -- 2.31 oz. ---- about \$ 150 per ton in ore values. He stated that there was a marked increase in the gold content from the earlier samples taken.

Review of Operations Operator sank a shaft to a depth of 30 ft. The shaft was vertical and followed a vertical vein. From the bottom of this shaft, a drift was started going west, following the side of the vein, which is vertical, with a strike of due east and west. The drift is now in a distance of about 35 ft., going west under a steep hill. The vein is from 3 to 4 ft. wide, but the mineralized part of the vein is only about 1 ft. wide. Most of the ore from the vein is left on the side of the drift, to be removed later. The ore in the vein is now a mixture of oxides and sulphides, the sulphides increasing as the drift is advanced and gets further below the surface of the hill.

Additional Engineer expected to visit the property, but Mr. Townsend informed him that the men were not working there at present on account of encountering too much water from the recent heavy rains.

Present Mining Activity Driving an adit into the hill. 2 men working.

Ore Values Jack Townsend estimated that the ore runs about 20 % lead and 6 to 8 % Cu. He stated that the last assay showed about \$ 94 per ton in ore values.

Review of Operations

Hack Townsend was reported to have started exploration work at the property about Feb. 22, 1961. Shortly, thereafter, he started driving an adit into the hillside, working part time only. This was continued intermittently throughout the summer. On July 5, 1961, Hack Townsend reported that he was driving an adit following a vein of ore from 8 to 10 inches wide, the ore running about 20 % in lead and about 6 % in Cu.

Jack Townsend, Hack Townsend's brother, now reports that he started working steady about one month ago, with 2 men working. He stated that the vein is now about one foot wide, with ore values as shown above. He has from 2 to 3 tons of ore stockpiled in his garage at Arivaca, which the engineer examined.

Field engineer attempted to visit the mine, but took the wrong road, and got back on the right track too late to make the visit.

Engineer will visit the mine on his next trip into the area, and will report more specific information at that time.
