Subject: Field Engineers Report. Information from James Barko and personal visit.

Location: Approximately Sec. 21 - T. 20 S. - R. 22 E., 3 miles SW of Tombstone along the Charleston Road.

Owner: James Barko, P.O. Box 262, Tombstone, Ariz.

Number of Claims: 1 fractional patented claim (about 12 acres).

Principal Minerals: 'Lead & Silver

Present Mining Activity: Mining, hand sorting and screening a small amount of leadsilver ore for mill tests.

Geology & Mineralization: Ore vein, about 18" wide, is exposed on the side of the shaft and open cut trenches.

Ore Values: Mr. Barko reports that samples taken on the vein ran 15% lead and 10 oz. of silver.

Old Mine Workings: 1 vertical shaft - depth unknown, but believed to be several hundred feet deep.

About 50 or 60 ft. of open trenching on both sides of the shaft. Some old open cuts.

Proposed Plans: Mr. Barko discussed with field engineer advisability of constructing a small mill (jigs or tables) of a few tons per day for milling the ore. Field engineer was of the opinion that a mill of such a small capacity would not be economical.

Additional: Mr. James Barko also owns the Terrible patented claim about 6 miles south and 2 miles west of Tombstone and the Rattler patented claim about 8 miles SW of Tombstone.
