SYNOPSIS REPORT

OWNER: P. T. Welsh & Co.

LOCATION: Property located in the Owens Mining District, Mohave County, Arizona, 14 miles north of Alamo Crossing. It is reached by a country road about 40 miles in length from Aguila. A new survey of an extension of Highway 93, now being made from a point near Kingman to Aguila, passes within a mile or so of this property.

TOPOGRAPHY AND GEOLOGY: The surrounding country is rolling to hilly. The formation for miles around the property consists of granite-gneissschist complex of pre-Cambrian origin, cut by later intrusive dykes and quartz veins; limestone being found near and south of this area.

VEINS: A number of veins traverse property; main vein, on which most development has been carried out is from 6 inches to 3 feet wide. The strike of this vein is from North to South; dip 45 deg. to the East.

DEVELOPMENT WORK: Consists of an inclined shaft on vein 50 feet deep; also a number of test pits.

ORE SHIPMENTS: Three men are now employed at property taking out shipping ore which assays from \$40.00 to \$60.00 in gold per ton, plus 3% copper. This ore, now being shipped, comes in a paystreak which ranges from 6 inches to 2 feet wide, occurring in short shoots; but this vein is traceable for a distance of a half mile or more. All in all, about 110 tons of the above grade of ore have been shipped. Aside from the paystreak mentioned, found on the hanging wall, from 3 to 4 feet of lower grade mill ore is found on the foot wall side of vein. Hence, this property has all the ear-marks that considerable money could be made out of it, provided capital could be found to open it up to a considerable depth.

CHARACTER OF ORE: The gangue is quartz and brecciated country rock. The ore is crysocolla, malachite and cuprite, associated with free gold; this class of ore being found in a great number of minimum of minimu

OPINION: This property warrants a careful investigation by anyone looking for a meritorious mine, or rather prospect, on which to spend some money.
