DESCRIPTION OF GOLD CROWN MINING CLAIM.

This claim belongs to Zellmer Weatherman of Arizona but his father Ed Weatherman has a power of attorney to sell and deed away the claim.

It is located in the San Domingo Mining District about four miles northeasterly from Morristown, Arizona.

It is a full claim adjoining the claims of Ed Weatherman, father of Zellmer and it is ~~an~~ lode and placer ground but is located as a lode claim. The Ox Wash runs through the claim and this is the principal wash valuable for concentrates and free gold found in the sands of this claim.

The assays show an average of about one dollar per yard or more in the sands of the Ox Wash, in gold; and the minerals tantalum, bismuth, and silver also are in the sands in commercial quantities. Tin, also is found in these sands.

The claim runs up and down the wash 1500 feet and is six hundred feet in width. It was once sold on contract for ten thousand dollars but the sale was not completed for reasons personal to the purchaser, even though several hundred dollars were paid on the sale contract.

The lode vein on the property is about thirty feet wide and it runs copper, silver and gold in commercial quantities. The ore can be steam shoveled from the surface but water is not found on the property as yet, there having been no well drilled on the claim. However there is a 400 foot well of water within about 1500 feet of this claim on the property belonging to Ed Weatherman to the northeast, he owning four claims nearby and adjoining the Gold Crown claim.

A conservative estimate of the placer sands yardage would be 400,000 cubic yards of one dollar sands on this one claim.

The Company's mineral claims and options consist of the following Arizona and British Columbia properties. Substantially all of the costs incurred to date relate to the Arizona properties.

Arizona properties

Gold Crown prospect

This gold prospect, consists of 10 contiguous mining claims, located in the Big Horn District, Maricopa County, Arizona, U.S.A., and comprises the Gold Crown and Gold Crown Nos. 1 - 9 claims. The property is situated some 20 kilometres south of Aguila, a small village approximately 100 kilometres west of Phoenix on Highway 60.

Pump prospect
