Property: 12 unpatented claims.

Location: Approximately (S-10) T. 5 S., R. 14 E.

Access: The property is reached by following the west side of the Gila River northwest from the San Pedro Bridge (at Winkelman) for 8 miles and thence south 2 miles.

Owners: Paul Traviso, Hayden, Arizona
Frank Monriquez, Hayden Junction, Arizona

Minerals: Copper with a little gold and silver.

Work: Two shafts were sunk on the claims, the deepest being 165 feet and the other is 100 feet deep. A raise from the bottom of the 165 foot shaft penetrates the vein.

Geology: The east portion of the Tortilla Range near the mine, is composed of granite, schist and the Apache Formation (pre Cambrian) which pitch under Gila Conglomerate overlain by lake beds and recent gravels. The vein lies in granitic rocks and is 18" to 4' wide. It has an EW trend and is nearly vertical. The gangue is quartz which contains chalcopyrite, chalcocite, malachite, chrysocolla and traces of thorite. 11 tons of ore from the better part of the vein yielded \$155.00. The high grade narrow hanging wall streak is reported to run \$130.00 in copper, gold and silver. The outcrop is continuous for 200 feet along the strike.
