Description: Topog. & Geog. The claim is situated on the lower slopes at the north end of the Santa Catalina range. The topography is comparatively rugged, although the hills are not very high. The ground covered by the claim lies along the ridge which forms the west side of Nugget Canyon. Vegetation is almost entirely lacking, consisting of cacti and low brush. The elevation above sea level here is close to 6000 feet.

Mine Workings: Amt. & Condition

The only workings on the property are two vertical shafts, each about 15 feet in depth, together with several shallow stopes and various open cuts. The shafts and most of the old stopes are open and accessible.

This claim covers an area of di its and limestone, the former heavily sheeted. Flat-dippin juartz streaks follow this sheeting, and these streaks have been gophered and stoped quite Geology & Mineralization extensively. All the workings are shallow. At one point in the diorite. near the limestone contact a vein of white quartz has been opened up by a shallow shaft. This vein strikes about N-S and has an almost vertical dip. The width is from three to four feet. While most of this quartz thus far exposed appears to be quite barren, there are specimens on the dump which show considerable galena and sphalerite.
