Subject: Report

The Golden Eagle group of claims is a regrouping of the Old Hat and Magrugada patented claims together with Memory Lane No. 1 and Golden Eagle Nos. 1 to 5 inclusive. The two patented claims are owned by Lloyd Basteen, Oracle, while the unpatented claims are held jointly by Basteen and A. C. Haigler of Phoenix. The group lies in the Old Hat mining district, about 7 miles southeast of Oracle on the Mt. Lemmon highway, in Pinal county. The approach from the highway is by 3/4 mile of well-graded all-weather road.

These claims are located in the low rolling foothills north of the Catalina Mts., and in the northern extremity of the Coronado National Forest. However, vegetation in the immediate area is sparse, mainly scrub oak. Elevation is about 4500 feet.

Numerous parallel quartz veins strike northwesterly through the predominating granite country rock known as Oracle Granite. A large diabase dyke parallels these along the westerly boundary, and some smaller monzonite and diorite intrusives are noted. The dip of the quartz veins is variable; the most prominent one on the Old Hat claim pitches about 60° in the vicinity of the Castro shafts. The veins vary in width from 12" to a reported 72" in a tunnel near the Castro shaft. On the Golden Eagle claims a number of quartz veins cross at right angles to the prevailing system. Some of these have been opened up for 100 feet or more and pockets found are reported to have yielded high-grade gold ore which was sold to Hugo Miller and other ore buyers. Some of the quartz outcrops on the Old Hat claim showed considerable tourmaline.

Claims composing the group have been worked intermittently for many years by owners and lessees. Most of the work was done by Sereriano Castro, deceased, who is reported to have lived on some of the claims for 65 years during which time he hunted pockets of gold ore, reducing the ore in an arrast re. Other gambusinos worked several adjoining claims over a long period of time in a similar manner. On the Golden Eagle No. 1 there is an old shaft reported as being 110 feet deep. Timber had been removed so it was inaccessible for sampling, but the dump indicates that a heavy iron pyrite was encountered with water coming in at this depth. Mr. Basteen sampled the pyritic ore and reported \$7 in gold with sulfides of copper coming in.

On the Old Hat claim, Mr. Castro had a shaft about 100 feet deep from which high-grade gold-lead ore was removed. This shaft has been completely filled by surface wash. He started another shaft during World War I, a few yards to the south of the old shaft. This follows the 60° dip of the vein and is now about 55' deep. An 18" vein of ore is showing which Mr. Basteen has sampled. It yielded \$20 in gold, 7½ oz. silver and 10% lead. No assay was reported for copper, but chalcopyrite and bornite appear in the dump material. This shaft is caved at the collar, timber having been removed, but could easily be repaired. More recently an ill-advised attempt was made by the lessees to drive a tunnel under this shaft. However, elevation of the portal did not permit a depth of more than 40 feet so a winze was sunk some 40 feet. Work was stopped by the

state mine inspector and the workings are now caved and not safe for examination. It was reported that a six foot vein was found here which ran high in lead, up to 21% being found in an ore shoot. It is estimated that the bottom of this winze would be about 25 feet below the foot of the shaft; permanent water was encountered here, the water table in the area appearing to be about 100 feet.

There is a modern house on the Old Hat claim, about 100 yards from the shaft. Mr. Basteen and his family reside here. A branch line of the San Carlos Indian Service trunk line furnished electric power. Domestic water is obtained from a 35 foot dug well equipped with pressure pumping system, and Mr. Basteen reports ample water supply.

The owners desire to deepen the Old Hat shaft at least 75 feet and develop ore indicated here. A compressor and hoist will be required. The proposed development program will require about \$10,000 to accomplish, for which the owners will offer a reasonable equity in the property.

Property situated in foothill slopes at north end of the Santa Catalina range. Rolling hills and shallow washes with a very light growth of brush and a few small oak trees. Elevation approximately 4500 feet above sea level.

Mine Workings: Amt. & Condition

One vertical shaft 110 feet in depth, with 75 feet of drifting on the 50 foot and 100 foot levels. Timber removed, but workings are open. Two vertical shafts, each approximately 50 feet in depth. Open but not timbered. Various shallow open cuts and pits.

The claims on this property cover an area in which the predominating rock is granite. This is in places by dykes of diorite. The ore is found in a series of quartz veins which strike NW-SE and have an almost vertical dip. These veins vary in width from a few inches to 3 feet, averaging about two feet wide. Hematite is fairly abundant through the quartz near the surface, while deeper down the ore shows galena and pyrite beginning to come in. The owners state that values hold up equally well in the sulphides; and that values will run from \$12 to \$15 per ton at many places on the property.

Ore: Positive & Probable; Ore Dumps, Tailings

There are several small dumps at the various workings, some of which are presumably ore; but the grade of this material is not known. Some of it is doubtless good. No estimate can be made of ore in place at the present stage of development.

Mine, Mill Equipment & Flow Sheet

There is no equipment of any sort on the property.

Road Conditions, Route

There is a very good short branch road leading into the property from the Oracle-Mt. Lemmon highway which is approximately one quarter of a mile distant. Turn right from highway at a point approximately 7 miles SE of Oracle. Big Six sign at fork of road.

Water Supply

No attempt has been made to develop water on the property; but conditions on adjoining ground indicate that this could be easily done.

Brief History Like other properties in this district, this one has produced considerable high grade ore, mainly from shallow open cuts along the vein outcrops. There are unfortunately, no settlement sheets available from any of these shipments; and therefore, no means of determining what the value of past production has been.

Special Problems, Reports Filed

No reports available. Development capital needed.

Remarks

In addition to the lode values, these claims cover an extension of the placer channel from the Lucky Strike property which adjoins it on the west. There is evidence at several points of placer work having been done along this channel. There is no data upon which to base an estimate as to the values contained in the gravel.
