

OWNERS: Florence S. Brown &amp; Andy Brown, Box 283, Chloride, Ariz.

METALS: Manganese: pyrolusite, psilomelane, etc.

LOCATION: This property consists of two adjoining groups of 12 claims, located about 1500 feet southeasterly from the Keystone mill.

MANGANIFEROUS GRAVEL DEPOSIT: The deposit consists of a strata of gravel, from 10 to 18 feet thick, cemented together with manganese oxides. It lies along benches on each side of Mineral Park wash, a longitudinal distance of 2500 feet by approximately 500 feet wide and outcrops at intervals along each side of the wash, near bed of the same.

DEVELOPMENT WORK: The deposit is in blanket form and has been exposed for sampling by numerous test pits and two shafts, showing a bed of ore ranging from 10 to 18 feet thick, as stated, and assaying, per Mr. Brown, 12, 14 and 17 percent manganese. The surface areas, occurring in patches, under which this blanket deposit is found, have not been surveyed; but evidently the deposit contains a very large tonnage of low grade Mn ore.

OVERBURDEN: Overburden of soil, sand and gravel, ranges from 2 to 15 feet in places and could be easily removed by power shovels, or by bulldozers.

James E. Bell, field engineer, U. S. Bureau of Mines, investigated and sampled property on March 21, 1942. He was followed by another Bureau engineer by the name of ~~Wastings~~ Herron, during June of this year, who also sampled property.

This property has the ear-marks of a large producer of low grade Mn ore, assaying between 10 &amp; 20 percent Mn. Ample water could be secured by sinking wells in Mineral Park wash to run a beneficiating plant of considerable size. This property is also reached by an excellent dirt road, which branches off from Highway 93 around 12 miles north of Kingman; length of said dirt road being about 8 miles.
