RRB WR 2/19/82: Ms. Sophi Katich of Los Angeles called to see if we had any production records on the Golden State Group in Sec. 8, 9, 16, and 17, T8N R3W. Her father Theodore Katich recently died and left them to her and she wants to sell them if she can. They consist of 5 patented claims.

Ms. Sophie Katich, 6015 Chariton, Los Angeles, CA 90056 called for information about the Golden State Group of patented claims which she owns. They are the Golden State, Buckhorn, San Francisco, Bullion and Gilbert in Sections 8, 9, 16 and 17, T8N R3W, Black Rock - Blue Tank District, Yavapai County.

Received telephone call from Sophie Katich 6015 Chariton Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90056. She says that she is the owner of the Golden State (file) Buckhorn, Gilbert House and Bullion patented claims in T8N R3W Sec. 8 & 9 and 16 & 17, Black Rock District. The patent number is 325815, Survey # 2973. She was trying to get information on production as they are trying to sell the claims. She said that the mine was reportedly operating in 1922-27. Checked all our references and could find nothing that gave any production figures or any other information of any volume. There is a mention of the mine in USGS Bulletin 782, page 185 and the Arizona Mining Journal of December 1918 mentions the mine. Talked to Bureau of Geology and Mineral Technology and they have no record of any production under that name.

Dear Ms. Katich:

I have researched our files for information on the Golden State Mining Company (Golden State, Buckhorn, Gilbert House and Bullion claims) as we discussed on the telephone on Tuesday, and can find nothing that will give you any production figures.

I do find a mention of the mine in United States Geological Survey Bulletin 782, page 185, but it gives no information except to mention that it was another mine in the area they are discussing on those pages.

You might write to the Bureau of Land Management, 2400 Valley Center, Phoenix, 85073 and ask for a copy of the surveyor's notes on that particular survey. You will need to provide them with the survey number.

Do you know whether or not there was any ore actually shipped from the mine? Patents were granted in those days without the mine having any actual production. It is possible that there were no shipments made or if any ore was shipped it was shipped with ore from another mine and there would be no "official" record of the Golden State ever shipping anything.

The USGS Bulletin 782 which I mentioned earlier does have information on mines in that area and may give you some background information on what other mines in the area were producing. It should be available at the Public Inquiries Office of the USGS in the Federal Building in downtown Los Angeles.

I also checked with the Bureau of Geology and Mineral Technology in Tucson. They have production records from mines and they can find nothing on the Golden State. Unless the mine had another name we apparently have hit a "brick wall" as far as production information is concerned.

I am sorry that I was not able to provide you with the production figures you needed.

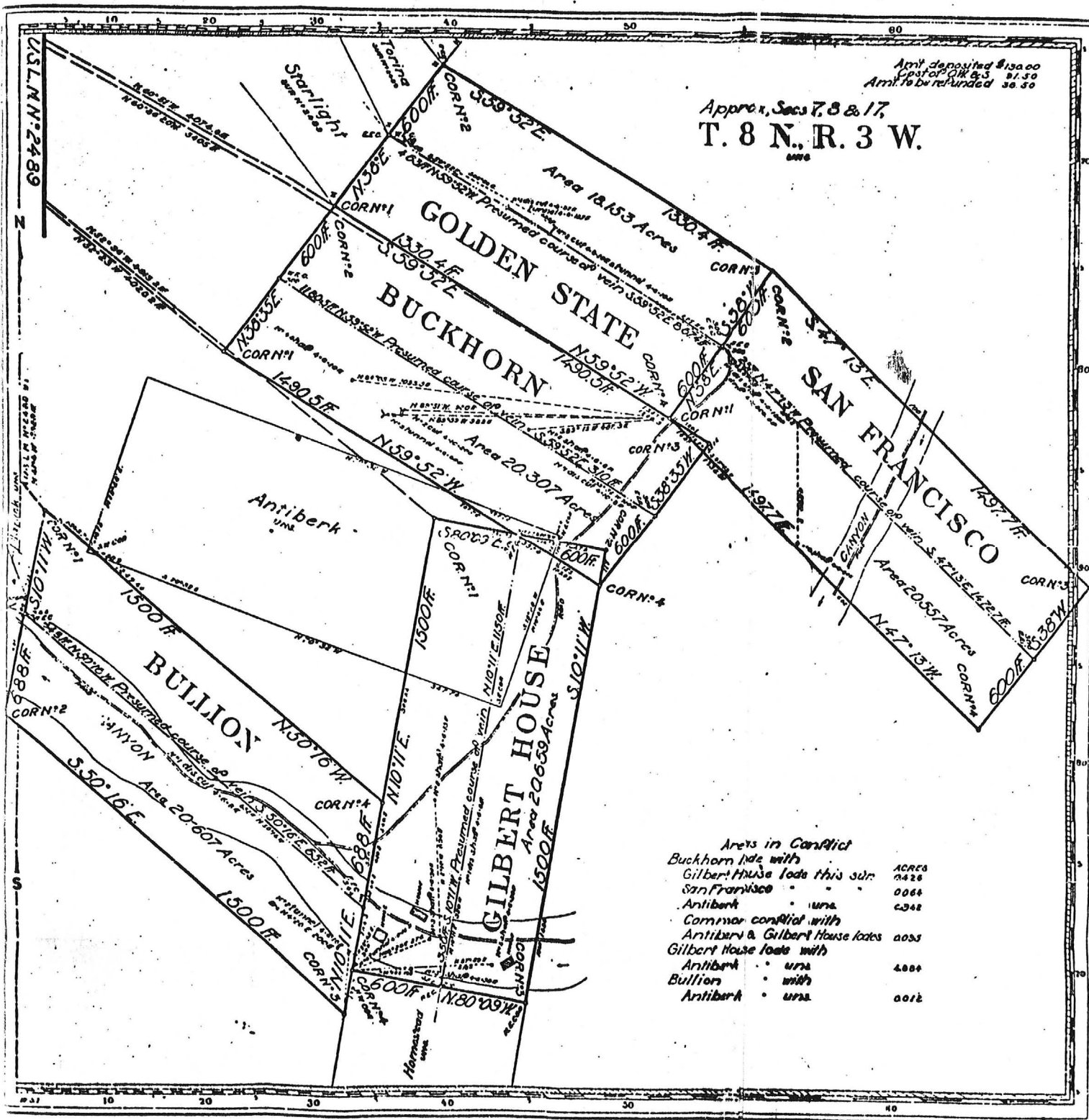
