Preliminary examination

This property comprises 7 unpatented claims held by Wm. Kay, Box 362, Wickenburg, Arizona. It is situated about 18 miles southwest of Wickenburg adjoining the Vulture mine on the west. A desert road off the Vulture road gives access.

The Kay claims endline the main Vulture workings and are in essentially the same formation, a granitic and rhyolitic porphyry with andesitic schist of frequent occurrence. On the Vulture claim immediately adjoining, this formation has been opened up for several hundred feet over a width of about 200 feet. On the Kay claims a large number of test holes have been sunk to a depth of 10 - 20 feet and much trenching is in evidence. One of these cuts, about 80 feet in length, was sampled by Mr. Kay and was reported to run \$2.50 in gold over the entire length. Values as high as \$8 - \$10 were obtained in specific areas and Mr. Kay reported his lowest assay as \$2.40.

The 80 foot cut referred to is still in values to the north and south. This is the most advanced development and should be continued in both directions until the walls are reached, when a representative sample may be cut.

This ore has been reported amenable to cyanidation. The Vulture Company is now preparing to mill up to 700 tons a day of apparently identical ore.

Water will have to be developed, but in the event of realization of several million tons of \$2.50 to \$3.00 ore, a pipe line to the Hassayampa River some 10 miles to the east would provide ample water for a large operation.

Surface sampling, followed by drilling, of this property will require considerable capital and on account of the marginal values involved, should not be undertaken on any other basis.



A man by the name of Ed Kay, Box 362, Wickenburg, was in this morning with a story about a prospect he has near the Vulture Mine.

His claim is called the Gold Knob and is located about 3/4 mile (air line) or 1-1/2 miles by road NW from the Vulture.

Kay says he has made an open cut 75 ft. long, 5 ft. deep and about 4 ft. wide across the vein and it shows \$83.00 au., 2%-3% cu., with a little silver and lead. He thinks he has the true extension of the Vulture vein.

You might look into this when you can combine it with other work in the district. It would be well to let Kay know at his Wickenburg address some days in advance, so he can go with you.

I am trying to get the Mudd-Wiseman interests to go into this area and do some considerable sampling, which will be absolutely necessary before anyone will consider taking over a low-grade property of this nature. The thing is so marginal, even considering an increase in price, that its only saving grace appears to be a potentially large tonnage.

Mr. Philip Wiseman has expressed interest, and as soon as he could get in touch with his son Kenneth, which he was endeavoring to do - Kanneth at present being in Sonora, Mex. - he will make further contacts. I hope Kay doesn't become too impatient, because I feel that something constructive has been accomplished by getting this firm to consent to look into the matter.

Kay held out the hope that some Wickenburg money was interested in a small way, and he was anxious to interest them through a favorable report from this department. I believe my report made a couple of weeks ago will demonstrate that this thing can only be considered as a possible big low-grade which must be very carefully sampled, and under such conditions it is going to be at least a \$20,0000 job to do the necessary cutting with possible drilling indicated. I believe it would be money thrown away to go at it from any other angle. Will keep you posted on developments from the Mudd-Wiseman angle which should materialize in a few days.
