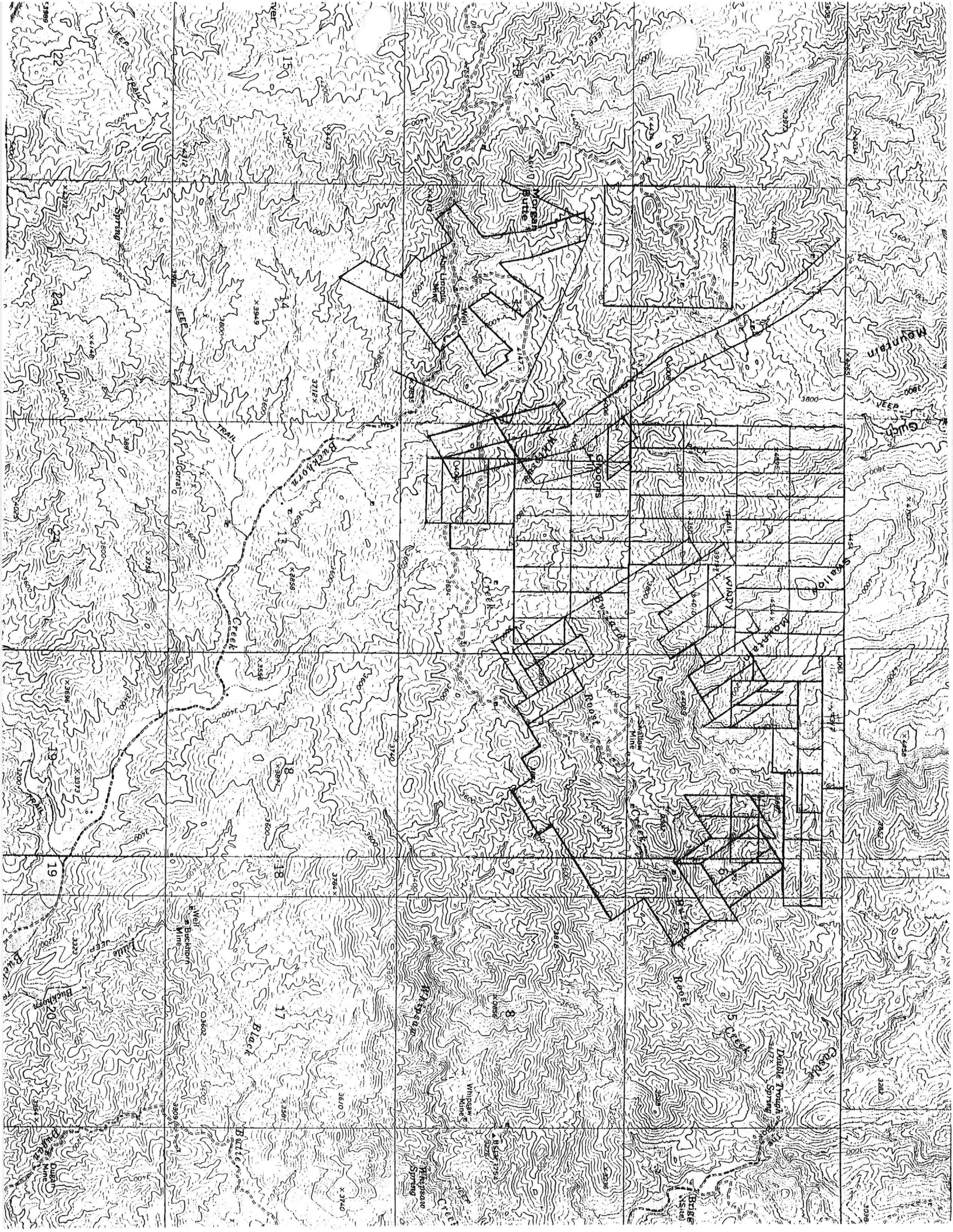

Box 2175, Wickenburg, Arizona 85358, and visited the Gold Rock #1-12 unpatented lode claims in the N½, Sec. 12, T8N, R3W, Yavapai County, held by Mr. Rubash. Mr. Rubash is in the business of putting properties together and promoting them. A field engineer's report will be written.

CJH WR 4/4/80: Worked on field engineer's report on Gold Rock #1-12 claims.

CJR WR 4/2²²/80: George Azar reported that he has located a large group of claims in the Blue Tanks District, Yavapai County. He also reported that he visited Gold Rock Mine which his firm has optioned, which adjoins the Swallow Mine. He reported the results on three assays on gold samples were: 40 tr.oz.Au/ton, .23 tr.oz.Au/ton, and .32 tr.oz.Au/ton, across a vein 12 feet wide.

KAP WR 6/20/80: George Azar reported he is continuing to locate claims and prospecting in Sam Powell Peak Area and along the Hassayampa River. Azar has located nearly a thousand claims in the last couple of months.

CJH WR 7/25/80: George Azar, P.O. Box 2527, Wickenburg, Arizona 85358, phone 684-2471 (also has a home in Fletcher Hills, California - see file card). Mr. Azar has dozed a new road from Sec. 14, T9N, R4W, ten miles east to Sec. 9, T9N, R3W, to provide access to lode and placer claims. The majority of the road is on state land (federal minerals). Some of the road has encroached upon a BLM Wilderness Study Area. The BLM is requesting that Mr. Azar justify the road construction.

George Azar constructed an access road through a portion of the study area without realizing that a permit was required in advance.

KAP WR 9/29/80: George Azar further reported he has built a road up the Hassayampa River to his placer on the Hassayampa so as to access the property for pilot runs and sampling.

SUBJECT: Field Examination

Gold Rock #1-12 standard size unpatented lode claims are in the N½, Sec. 12, T8N, R3W, are contiguous and oriented long axis N-S and held by Grover Rubash, P.O. Box 2175, Wickenburg, Arizona 85358. Mr. Rubash is in the business of putting properties together and promoting them. He is an experienced miner.

The property was visited with Mr. Rubash and two young men who may be interested in developing the claims: George Azar, Azar Enterprises (custom homes), 623 Aldwych, Fletcher Hills, California 92020, and Tom Thompson of San Diego, California. Neither are knowledgeable about mining.

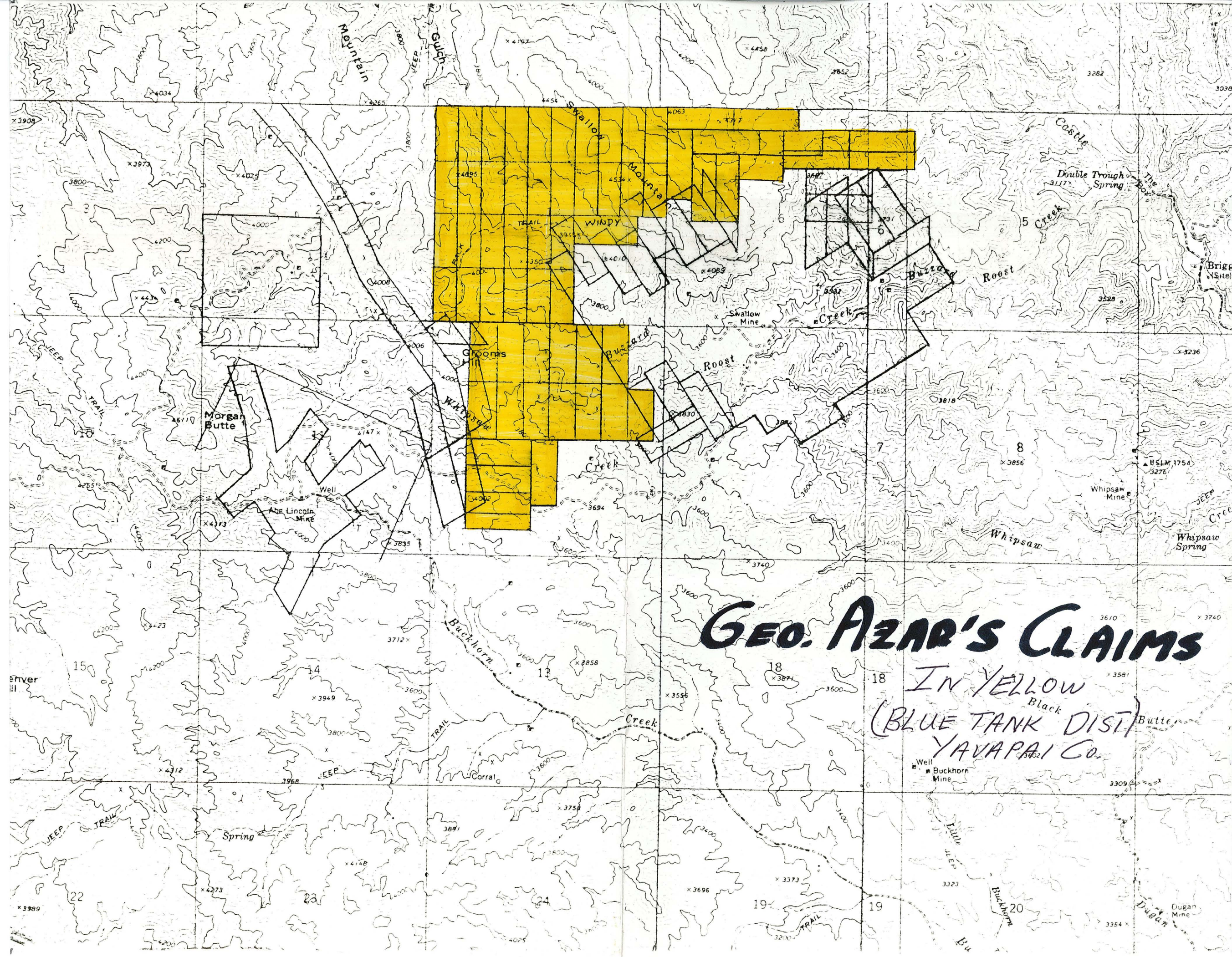
ACCESS: A four-wheel drive or high clearance truck is necessary for the last few miles. Take the Constellation Road northeast out of Wickenburg, to a fork nine miles out in the NW¼, Sec. 18, T8N, R3W. Turn right and proceed east four miles to the Abe Lincoln Mine, SW¼, Sec. 11, T8N, R3W. Turn left (north) on side road and go 1-1/2 miles to a corral and windmill, turn north on side road and proceed 1/2 mile to claims.

GEOLOGY: The claims lie east of Groom Hill in an area of moderate relief composed of Pre-Cambrian Yavapai Schist and Bradshaw granite locally intruded by dikes of diorite and rhyolite porphyry. Several quartz vein striking northwest and dipping north were observed. They range from 14" to 6' in width and are heavily stained with limonite. Some specularite and chrysocolla was observed. The specularite is probably regionally metamorphosed hematite. Gossans are common in the area.

Note: The claims lie 1/2 to 1 mile east of the Swallow Mine which has a production record of approximately 8,300 tons of ore, containing 2,640 oz. of Au and 3,800,000 pounds of Cu between 1915-16 and 1937-39.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Encouraged Mr. Azar to conduct an orderly precious metal sampling program to produce an assay map of the claims. Further decisions will be made on the outcome of this program.
