

Present Activity: There is no mining activity. However, mine tours are conducted daily for tourists hourly between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. by George and Sally King. The charge for same is 75¢ for adults, 25¢ for children, and 50¢ for service men. The trip lasts about 45 minutes, during which time the visitor is taken through the Good Enough Mine and the Million Dollar Stope.

George & Sally King started these tours on Feb. 9, 1963 and report that they are operating by a joint deal or agreement with the Tombstone Development Co.

They reported that the Civilian Defense have picked out a place in the mine which can serve as an air raid shelter for 1200 people. The preparation and maintenance of this air raid shelter will not interfere with the conduction of the mine tours, but will serve as an added attraction.

Owners San Marino Development Corp., 603 Gibraltar Tower, 9107 Wilshire Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif. According to a letter sent to the City of Tombstone under date of May 2, 1962 by this company, they had purchased the interests of Newmont Exploration Co. There was no information in regard to the terms of the purchase, however, whether cash, time payments, or option.

Principal Minerals Silver

Present Activity There is no mining activity. However, Mine Tours are conducted daily for tourists, hourly between 9 A. M. and 8 P. M. The charge for same is 75 ¢ for adults and 25 ¢ for children. The trip is reported to last about 45 minutes, during which time the visitor is taken through the Good Enough Mine and the Million Dollar Stope.

Proposed Plans Thomas Pitcher, Mayor of Tombstone, informed me that they have plans with the Civilian Defense Dept. to make an Air Raid Shelter out of the underground workings still open in the Good Enough Mine.
