Development Work: One large bulldozer cut, 400' long and up to 35' on the face, cut across a dike of basic to intermediate igneous rock (andesite-porphry (?) or diabase or both). The dike has copper mineralization to a limited degree. It dips 60° West, and strikes N-S to N 10° W. It is strongly stained by iron oxides and contains some magnetite. The copper minerals are chrysocolla and "grey" copper (probably chalcocite). Several small cuts mainly were in sheared diorite. Some drilling was done along the big cut, but the results are not known.

The intrusive here may be a continuation, or appendage, of the dike on the J. Gould Property to the North. J. Gould will get his brother to fill out a Mine Owner's Report.
