This property comprises six (6) claims, of which two only are considered in this report, the others not having been developed, altho holding every indication that they are comparable with the two described.

LOCATION. These claims are situated in the Cedar Mining District, in the Hualapai Mountains, on the west slope, being about 25 miles from Yucca, in Mohave County, Arizona, at an elevation of 5000 feet, and in the vicinity of the Borianna Mine (tungsten).

WATER. Water in tunnels will develop sufficient for a large mill. A spring furnishes all water for domestic purposes.

DEVELOPMENT. Three tunnels, all in ore being 150 feet 150 feet, and 480 feet respectively.

The width of the ledge at the surface varies from 1 1/2 to 2 feet wide. In the lower tunnel, 350 feet below the outcrop, width of ore is over seven (7) feet.

Values are increasing slowly but surely with depth, ore breaks easily and walls stand well.

All assays taken were cut clear across the face and no picked samples were included, thus giving a true value of the contents that would be mined.

Over one hundred tons of sorted ore on dump awaiting transportation. Over ten thousand (10,000) tons of potential ore available, to be broken down and shipped or treated.

Site for a tunnel which could be driven on the ore, would eventually develop over 1100 feet of backs in the deepest part.

ASSAYS. Values very consistent and regular, showing 55 to 62 ozs silver, .01 to .03 oz in gold and from 18% to 29% lead.

TRANSPORTATION. Main road now being widened and put in good shape by the C.C.C or F.E.R.A., leaving about 2 1/2 miles to be opened, which could be done for a maximum of \$2500.00. Silver content of ore on dump will more than pay for this item.



