

Dear Concerned Citizen:

The Bradshaw Ranger District has received two Plans of Operation and an amendment to an approved Plan of Operation for exploration projects to be conducted on the Forest. The legal description for the first proposal is Section 33, Township 12 North, Range 3 West; the legal description for the second proposal is Section 17, Township 13 North, Range 1 West; and the third is located in Section 20, Township 11 North, Range 2 West.

The first proposal calls for the digging of a 30'W x 60'L x 40' deep pit for the purpose of sample collection. The excavated material will be run through a vibrator screen and onto a shaker table where it will be washed and the samples removed. The pit will be backfilled with the excavated material following sampling. Sample material would be evaluated off site. Reclamation would also include spreading salvaged topsoil and revegetating the site. As part of the approval, the operator would be required to post a reclamation bond sufficient for rehabilitation of the site.

The second proposal involves rotary drilling four exploratory holes on an existing claim. Two of the holes will be on existing sites. The other two holes will develop two new 30'W x 50'L sites and require the construction of 300' x 12' of new roadway, not to exceed 15% slope. Several small oak and juniper shrubs will be disturbed or removed. The holes will be covered all times and the sites rehabilitated when geological evaluations are completed. As in the previous proposal, the operator will be required to post a reclamation bond.

The third proposal involves placer exploration in Milk Creek. The proponent has proposed use of an 8 inch dredge for sampling in the creek bottom. No disturbance outside the channel has been proposed. The site will be reclaimed upon completion and the operator will be required to post bond to insure this.

The property comprises 2 placer claims located in the canyon of the Hassayampa river about 12 miles easterly from Kirkland Jct.

Operator: Master Mining Co., Box 66, Yarnell, Arizona

Owner: A. L. Rhoades of Chicago, Illinois. He is a principal in the Sun Electric Co. (testers, - appliances) of Chicago. For a number of years he has operated a placer property at Gold Creek, Montana. He has initiated this Arizona project in the hope of being able to conduct a gold mining operation the year round (the Montana operation is seasonal).

Supt. John H. McIntosh.

The company proposes to work two small gravel benches on the west bank of the river. One of these borders the river at slightly higher elevation than the river bed. The other is on the rim of the river canyon wall about 100 feet above the river bed.

At the time of visit a dozer, an end-loader unit, and some grizzly bars, sluice boxes, etc. had been placed on the property and other equipment was to be delivered. Some preliminary testing of the bench gravels was in progress. An attempt had been made to reach bedrock in the river proper but the depth was altogether too great (estimated 80') for economical working.

The work force consisted of four men.

4. PROPOSED OPERATION

We intend to perform an extensive sampling program on all of the claims. We will employ various types of drilling and digging machines, such as a "Klam", backhoe and bulldozer. This equipment will be used to extract nominal one cubic yard samples. The samples will be processed with our placer evaluation unit. This

unit is mounted on a 45' trailer and incorporates a grizzly, primary trommel, secondary trommel, nugget trap, concentrating table, jig, liquid concentrator/clarifier, power plant, pumps and drive motor. A reservoir will contain about 5,000 gallons of water, which is recirculated after clarification. The power plant is a 20KW unit, powered with a Detroit Diesel 2-71 diesel engine. The diesel engine will be fitted with an approved spark arrester (Gill, Mod. No. 6C30).

Lodging for Brattain employees will be a 5th wheel camper.

Sanitation will be provided with a portable toilet.

After processing, the sample material will be graded back into the terrain. All significant holes will be filled. It is our intent to leave the surface resources as nearly as is feasible in their original condition. Known archeological sites will be protected. Any new evidence of archeological sites will be reported to you, should we discover them.

Location: About 7 miles E of Kirkland Junction on the Hassayampa River

Owner: **Pete Speakman**

Operator: **Wm. Mathews, 322 E. Earl Dr., Phoenix, Arizona, plans to lease the property and start a small operation in the near future.**

Status: **Inactive at this date.**

Development: **Several small cuts, pits, and tunnels in the gravel banks.**

Geology: The country rock is schist overlain by thick flows. Small quartz veins occur in the schist, and these are probably the source of the placer gold. The placers occur in a steep walled canyon and are of two types. First, there are remnants of older gravel bars which in places form benches above the present stream. These, according to the owner, carry good gold values. There is a considerable yardage present. Second, there are the sand and gravel bars which make up the present flood plain of the stream and which are in part derived from the older gravels. These younger deposits undoubtedly carry some gold values too. Mr. Mathews has done some sampling and has assay reports. Some concentrates were shown to me by the owner, who said they were from this property. The gold was medium to coarse with some small nuggets. The nuggets and flakes were flat with smooth edges and fairly rough surfaces. Some were bright, but some were coated.

A fault cuts diagonally across the stream on this property, the north wall of the canyon shows severe tilting. As a result, the schists and flow rocks form natural riffles in the stream bed. This should be taken into consideration when this deposit is worked.

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
