



MEMORANDUM

Hefner Group
(Tombstone Mng. Dist.)

To: Director, Dept. Mineral Resources
From: George A. Ballam

I went over this property with Hefner on Monday. There is little development there, and less ore showing, but a chance to make comparison with adjacent claim having more development and on the same strike.

The claims, 6 patented, are about two miles north of Charleston and about two miles off the Charleston highway. They are in rolling country which carries considerable overburden. Only a few shallow holes are to be seen and the rock appears to be a porphyry where visible. However, there is a well-defined strike across the country in an east-west direction and apparently dipping about 75° to south. It is highly brecciated but showing some lead and zinc values where it tightens up, as evidenced from material on one of the dumps, probably from the bottom of a 50ft hole.

Hefner is not asking for a loan. I do not believe the property can qualify for one. He would like to lease to some one who can put the 50' hole down say 50' or 100' more, at least to water level where the sulfides are coming in. There is little to be seen at present.

As far as the comparison is concerned: About one/mile to the west, and on what is obviously the continuation of this formation, there are a number of deeper cuts and holes. One incline has been pushed down into the sulfides and the dump shows excellent rosin jack. It is supposed to be about 80'. Others show zinc carbonate in the upper portions. All holes are gassy and posted so I could get little information, but dumps show ore.

It would seem that Hefner's best bet would be to get some person who would do a little development. There is a good chance to hit, if the neighboring zinc showings mean anything. The old man is crippled and can do nothing himself.

Dear Mr. Hefner:

I have your letter of December 28 with the money order for \$1. I have endorsed the money order back to you for payment as the Department is unable to accept any payment for their services. I hope you will pardon my returning this to you, but it would be a little irregular to accept it.

I have talked with George A. Ballam regarding your property and he has stated that whereas you could apply for a loan if you so desire, he felt as though additional work should be done on the property before it would really qualify for such a loan.

It is optional with the owner however and if you so desire, you could apply.

Mr. Ballam looked over the property and states that there is a good showing there and that an additional 50 or 100 feet in depth might show a good grade of ore. The assays sent are interesting but are rather low grade and the property needs additional development.

I would suggest that you send a sample to Mr. Lindenberg with the other information that he requests and he may be enough interested to carry on with you and do the additional development work which seems necessary.

Mr. Ballam states that the adjoining properties have shown good results when their workings entered the water level zones where the sulphides came in strongly.


