

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RRB WR 5/9/80: Assisted Dick Harvell draw map and fill out claim notice for an association placer claim he is filing with his father-in-law, Robert Del Grasso, 6812 E. Dynamite Blvd, Cave Creek, Arizona 85331. Claim is named the Del Grasso and is located on Poland Creek above the confluence with Crazy Basin Creek, Black Canyon District, Yavapai County.

---

KAP WR 7/4/80: Bob Del Grosso reported on activity at his Jack Ass Mine, Yavapai County. The mine is a placer operation located on his 40-acre Jack Ass Placer Claim at the confluence of Poland Creek and Crazy Basin Creek in Sections 34 and 35, protracted in T11N, R1E. He reported he is working a narrow gulch full of boulders by winching out boulders and dredging the loosened material. He exhibited 18.2 grams of sizable jewelry gold nuggets which he reported to be one week-end's production. The nuggets were quite flattened and high in silver and possibly copper. A claim map on topo base was provided for the Department's files.

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AWB WR 8/10/80: Don Del Grosso, Box 825 Star Route 2, Cave Creek, Arizona 85331, loaned the museum 57 small gold nuggets from the Bradshaw Mts for display. (Jack Ass Mine).

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KAP WR 12/19/80: Bob Del Grosso reported that he is continuing work on his Jack Ass Placer Deposit on Poland Creek, Yavapai County. He has added two additional claims: the Henny and the Jenny. He is planning to start working the property full time.

NJN WR 5/15/81: Bob Del Grasso (card) 6812 E. Dinamore Blvd, Box 825, Star Route 2, Cave Creek Arizona 85331, was in. He continues to work his Jack Ass Placer Mine, Yavapai County (file) and recovers pea size jewelry nuggets. To increase the volume of material worked, he is planning to bring in a back hoe. The conflict of interest between his claims and those of Houston Minerals and Resources, and Darrel Hand, remains unresolved.

KAP WR 6/26/81: Bob Del Grosso reported he is continuing production of placer gold from his Jack Ass deposit.

**PLAN OF OPERATIONS FOR CLAIMS IN THE PRESCOTT NATIONAL FOREST**

**FOREST SERVICE RESPONSE TO NOTICE OF INTENT TO OPERATE**

We have evaluated your request to extend the Roadrunner's Plan of Operation for the Bradshaw District. Your request was evaluated pursuant to 36 CFR 228.4 and FSM 2817.1.

This extension will be approved with the conditions outlined below, which I ask that you read through, sign, and return. Final approval will occur after you have returned the signed conditions and posted the reclamation bond. Please note that the approval does not constitute recognition or certification of claim ownership by any person named herein. Approval also does not constitute, now or in the future, recognition or certification of the validity of any mining claims to which it may relate, or to the mineral character of the land on which the claims lie.

You have appeal rights under 36 CFR 251 Subpart C. A written notice must be submitted to the Forest Supervisor, Prescott National Forest, 344 S. Cortez, Prescott, AZ. 86303, and simultaneously with the Bradshaw District Ranger, 2230 E. Hwy 69, Prescott, AZ., 86301, within 45 days after the Date of Decision. Any Notice of Appeal must contain the specific information required in 36 CFR 251.90.

1. The Forest Service reserves the right to review the bond as the project progresses, and when necessary, to adjust the bond to more effectively cover the cost of reclaiming the project area.
2. The operators will have in their possession a copy of the approved Plan of Operations whenever they are operating. This approval and the attached appended conditions must be shown upon request to any State, Federal or local officer in the administration of their official duties.
3. It is the responsibility of the operating plan holders to determine whether or not he is on another's mining claim. The operators understand that it is illegal to remove minerals from another's mining claim without the owner's approval.
4. The operation will be limited to suction dredging of stream gravel's using a 3" or smaller dredge, working within the active stream channel of the drainage's; the operations will not involve any mining activity taking place above the high water mark of the creek. This approval also applies to sluice boxes and other less disturbing mining equipment.  
  
The use of 4" dredges will be allowed by club members listed on the attached sheet.
5. Only one area of operation (AOP) will be active at any one time. The area in question will consist of the actual dredge hole, the settling pond or portable settling pond (PSP), and the surrounding equipment set-up area. Each area must be reclaimed before starting work on a different portion of the claim.
6. If water is discharged from equipment into the drainage, settling ponds or PSP (portable settling ponds) will be utilized to filter fines from the water and to minimize turbidity in the active stream channel. The water quality of the creek will be visually monitored for impacts from the operation. Turbidity in the watercourse shall not exceed 50 NTU's (Nephelometric Turbidity Units) due to mining activity (State of Arizona Water Quality Standards). It is the responsibility of the operator to monitor water quality at the dredging site, and to keep water quality within acceptable limits. All activity will cease if turbidity is above 50 NTU's, and operating conditions will then be modified to improve water quality.
7. This operation will not involve any dam construction within the drainage.

## PLAN OF OPERATIONS FOR CLAIMS IN THE PRESCOTT NATIONAL FOREST

8. Reclamation will be ongoing in the course of this operation. Excavations will be filled in before the operator moves into another area, and before he leaves the claim area. All backfilling will return the creek to its natural elliptical shape. Fines will be tamped into the bottom of the dredge hole and covered with coarse gravel.

9. No trees or shrubs (live or dead) will be removed or undercut in the course of this operation. Dredging and work activities will not undermine or damage, in any way, trees or shrubs in the claim area. No riparian vegetation (cottonwoods, willows, alders, ash, and sycamore) will be disturbed. For each inch of diameter of riparian tree or shrub, 1' of radius buffer from the trunk of the plant will be allowed (i.e., a 1" diameter tree would have a 1' radius of no activity. A 5" diameter tree would have a 5' radius buffer of no activity). For coniferous species (ponderosa pine, Douglas fir, white fir) within the active channel, the buffer of no activity would equal the vertical projection of the crown perimeter to the ground. Where limbs are missing from a side of a tree, a minimum 5' radius buffer of no activity will apply for trees 5" in diameter and greater. For trees less than 5" in diameter, a minimum 3' radius will apply.

Willow stands will have a 5' buffer of no activity. The buffer will start at the outside edge of the base of the stand.

Grass and sedge clumps with a greater than 6" base will be retained.

10. Any dead and down logs and/or branches in the area of operation may be removed in order to process the stream gravel's under them. Those woody items removed must be replaced in approximately the same orientation and location once the area of operation is relocated or the operation ceases. Existing pool locations must be retained. During periods of drought when the only water left in the drainage is in isolated pools, dredging may not take place. Because these pools are often the last refuge for riparian species, dredging, panning and sluicing activities may take place only when there is a surface flow of water. Only drywashing may take place when there is no surface flow of water.

11. The club will establish (with help from Bradshaw Ranger District Minerals personnel) photo points. These points will be established and photos taken before and after operations. The club will provide the Minerals Staff With 3" x 5" print copies of these photos (color, non-Polaroid, preferably 35mm), for inclusion in the project file.

12. All internal combustion engines will be equipped with an approved spark arrestor during operation on National Forest land.

13. Occupancy on the claim will be limited to 14 days within a 30 day period, pursuant to Forest regulations (36 CFR 261.58(a) and Forest Order #09-72. Campsite will be kept neat and clean at all times.

14. Trash, sewage, human waste and debris generated at the mining operation will be removed from National Forest land and disposed of at public waste facilities [36 CFR 261.11 (c), (d)].

15. All State and Federal regulations will be complied with. This includes all applicable Federal and State regulations, rules and ordinances regarding water quality. This may include Clean Water Act Section 404 permit and Section 401 State Water Quality Certification.

16. Storage of fuel, oil or other hazardous materials is required to meet all pertinent State of Arizona regulations. A copy of these regulations may be obtained from the State Mine Inspector's Office. Disposing of any hazardous materials, pollutants or other foreign substances on National Forest land is strictly prohibited. All pollutants should be kept from being spilled on National Forest System Lands. Extreme care must be taken to avoid spilling pollutants close to or within any watercourse.

17. All Forest users must comply with the Access Management Policy. This policy prohibits cross-country travel, including vehicle access to many claim areas. Access is restricted to Forest System signed and numbered roads



## PLAN OF OPERATIONS FOR CLAIMS IN THE PRESCOTT NATIONAL FOREST

(except where specific permission has been given for the use of other roads). Ingress and egress on National Forest System roads will be controlled to minimize surface damage when soil conditions are wet. Operations will cease when the Forest Officer in charge determines that roads are being damaged. Damage to roads used by the operator other than ordinary wear and tear, will be repaired by the operator. NOTE: to insure compliance with the Access Management Policy it is recommended that forest users purchase a Prescott National Forest map.

18. No activity is authorized which is likely to jeopardize the continued existence of a threatened or endangered species or a species proposed for such designation, as identified under the Federal Endangered Species Act; no activity is authorized which is likely to destroy or adversely modify the critical habitat of such species. If any new threatened, endangered, or sensitive species are found to be utilizing the project area, timing restrictions may be imposed upon the operation to protect the species. Should changes to this Plan of Operations become necessary due to the above circumstances, the Forest Service will notify the operators and work with them to implement the necessary changes.

19. Any activity beyond that described herein or as set forth in the original proposal, will require an amendment to the Plan of Operations or a new plan, and may require additional bonding and environmental analysis.

20. Site specific written approval from the Forest Officer in charge may be granted to modify any of these Appended Conditions for short duration, low impact changes.

21. The reclamation bond for this operation will be reviewed annually and recalculated, if necessary, to insure monies held are sufficient to complete the desired reclamation. The operator is required to post any additional funds necessitated by the bond recalculation within 30 days of notification by the Forest Service.

22. The approval for this extension of the club's plan of operation expires on June 1, 2001. The operator understands that operating without an approved Plan of Operations or Notice of Intent is a violation of 36 CFR 26a.10a, punishable by a fine of \$200.00. Should an extension of the approval period of the operation be desired, the operator will file a written request for the extension, at least 30 days before the expiration date of the approval.

23. The stipulations and/or modifications listed above will be reviewed whenever an amendment is made to the approved Plan of Operations, or at such time that the plan expires. Appended conditions to the operating plan will be modified as the situation warrants.

24. The following conditions apply to specific claims, as indicated:

a. The Roadrunner #1 and #2, Wolf#1 through #6, JDR #1 through #3, Laura Kay #1, Janet Lynn #2, Sharon Lee Group, Gold Palace #5 through #8, Bonny, Clyde, Clinton, Hidden Treasure, Cleator area claims in the southwest of Section 14, T11N, R 1 E, Lady Bug, the Sharon Lee, and the Jackass, Jenny and Hinney Claims are all under lowland leopard frog timing restrictions; no mining activity is allowed on these claims between January 1 and April 15.

b. The Gold Palace #1 through #5 are under Mexican spotted owl PAC timing restrictions; no mining activity is allowed from March 1 through August 31.

c. No mining activity is allowed in the riparian enclosure in the Brave #4 Claim.

d. No mining activity is allowed from April 1 through August 1 in the north half of the Brave #1 Claim.

e. No mining activity is allowed on the south half of Poland Creek, due to the fact that the south half of the claims are in the Castle Creek Wilderness.

This letter is to inform you that you have inadvertently staked over mining claims currently held by us. Your claim as filed in book 1305, page 464 overlaps load claims filed in 1970 and 1973 and recorded in book 819, pages 34 thru 37 of Yavapai County, Arizona.

As you may know, that portion of a placer claim is not valid when placed over a prior existing lode claim. Our claims are current this date and may be found in BLM lead file AMC 46037.

I have enclosed a map for clarification. As you may see on that map your are also in conflict with a placer claim called Shanon Lee #1. While the Shanon Lee placer claims overlap our load claims, that portion of those claims outside our boundaries appears to be valid and current. Those claims may be found in BLM lead File AMC 74734 and belong to D.G. Hand, Sr. of Camp Verde.
