WR KP 6-22-78 - Jimmy Fulton, 2714 E. Willeta, Phone - 275-1309, of Silas C. Brown and Associates, Geologic Consultants, 2401 West Southern Avenue, B-78, Tempe, 85282, discussed their Jane group of claims, The group consists of 73 claims near Copper Creek Springs in Copper Basin, Secs. 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, 14, and 15, T. 19N., R.1W. The group of owners have had geologic mapping, geochemical sampling, induced polarization surveys and core drilling done on the property. Both Utah Construction and Exxon have drilled the property. 11-7-78 bh

WR/KP 1/18/79 - owner of the Jane Group of claims, reported he is still trying to interest an exploration company in the property. He reports to have traced five different intrusive stages of quartz monzonite over an area 8000 ft. by 6000 ft.




## COPPER BASIN, Yavapai County, Arizona (37% %)

The Copper Basin property consists of 73 unpatented lode mining claims in the Silver Mountain mining district, Yavapai County, Arizona. The Jane No. 1 through No. 73 lode claims are on lease to the Copper Basin Grubstake, of which MEC holds a 37½ % interest. Stockholders of Mineral Economics Corporation (other than Tognoni's) hold another 52½ % interest in the Copper Basin Grubstake.

The 1981-82 assessment work on the Copper Basin project consisted of road repair and layout of drill sites. In 1981 H.E. Nelson and H.C. Tognoni conducted a geological study of the area and reviewed existing data, drill logs and core and concluded that a disseminated copper and molybdenum deposit of considerable magnitude exists in the Copper Basin claims, the quantity and quality of which is yet to be fully determined. Information to date indicates the possible presence of 500,000,000 tons containing a minimum of 0.4% copper equivalent lies within the Copper Basin unit.

NJN WR 9/6/85: John Challinor reported that he and Hale Tognoni recently finished the assessment work on the Jane Group of claims (f) in Yavapai County. The claims cover a porphyry copper molybdenum deposit that may total 500 million tons. The property is now held by Mr. Tognoni thru the Copper Basin Grubstake.





Wm Lowe, said that his group owns 50 claims (Travis Group) west of and adjoining the Lane Mine, and that they had completed a 3 mile-long access road for assessment work.

Wed. May 19 - Tried to gain information regarding Travis Claims supposedly located on the W slope of Lane Mtn., by George "Smokey" Rowe, Billy Lowe of Wagoner, David Peters and Robert Connell. Little could be learned about these men and some doubt was expressed about their having claims in the very inaccessible region of Lane Mtn.

Thurs. May 20 Visited Don Alexander of the Forestry Service in Prescott, He had no knowledge of Rowe, Lowe, et al regarding Travis claims on W. slope of Lane Mtn. He stated that the area was very inacessible.

Work: Most of location and assessment work completed. Now being tested by Union Carbide Nuclear Corp.

Minerals:

(1) Molybdenum and copper.

(2) Lead-silver

According to Bowe the area consists of granite intruded by a wide "diorite" dike. The dike trends almost due north and appears to be nearly vertical. Vein-like deposits border both sides of this dike and these are mineralized with galena and silver. An earlier copper-molybdenum mineralization appears to favor the granite. The lead-silver is variably lenticular, whereas the copper-molybdenite is in stringers and blebs, the former being somewhat more prevalent. General samples are reported by Rowe to run up to 2 per cent copper and up to 1 per cent of MoS2, although the average MoS2 is probably much less. 400 samples were taken along rough coordinates, by drilling shallow holes and blasting them. The MoS2 veinlets range from knifeedge to 1/8 inch wide. The copper is for the most part, oxidized although some chalcopyrite has benn observed. The copper-molybdenum material is largely in the Travis Group or north group, whereas the lead-silver is more prevalent in the L & R Group to the south, apparently favoring the granite. In the L & R group silver assays showed up to 80 ounces per ton, the higher grade being in relatively narrow stringers. The L & R has one new shaft 15 feet deep on an incline of 15 degrees to the north. At one place west of the dike a short distance, gold values up to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ounces per ton were found, but the extent of this is not known.

Mr. George V. Rowe of 7340 N. 40th Drive, Phoenix called in the office. He has no knowledge of this or any other mining property filed in his name. He called Mr. Connell (also listed as an owner) and Mr. C. knew nothing of the property or any of the people listed. Mr. Connell now lives on Flower Street.

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
