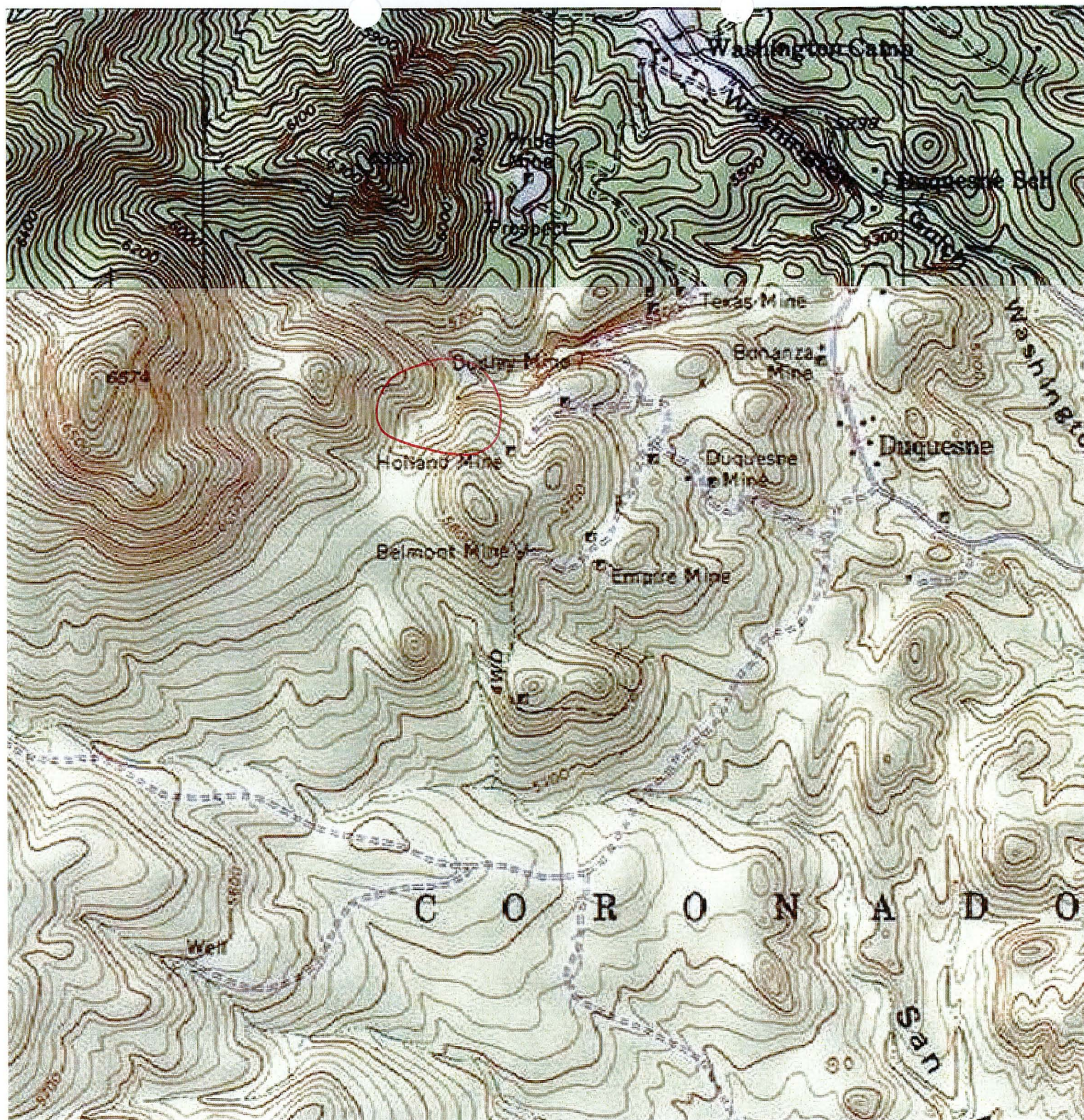

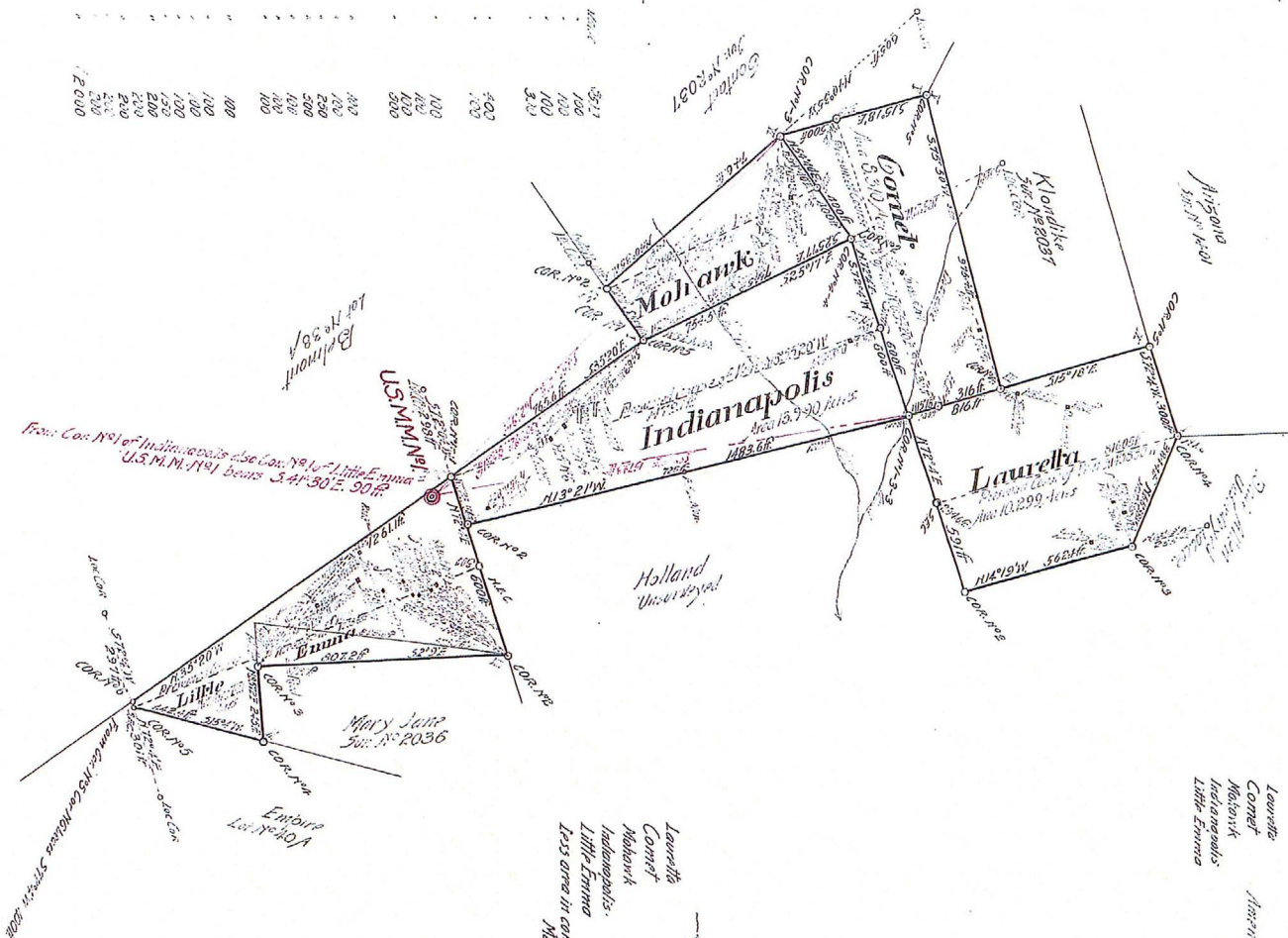

Present Operations Nash Mines is diamond drilling this property with 1 diamond drill rig, (their own equipment used). They are now working on the 5th drill hole. First 4 holes had to be stopped at a depth of about 28 ft., on account of hitting a block of quartzite. The 5th hole is being drilled at a new location, and is now down to a depth of 20 ft. No ore encountered yet in any of the holes.

Geology Strong surface showings of iron gossan found on the property, which operators believe is favorable for the finding of an ore body below same.
