Location Approximately Sec. 35-- T 13 S -- R 12 E

10 miles NW of Tucson. Take Silver Bell Road north for 7 miles. Turn

left (west) on Sweetwater Drive. Drive 2 1/2 miles west on Sweetwater Drive to

Mr. Canfields home. Drive approx. 3/4 miles SW from his home to the quarry.

Number of Claims Land held in fee.

Owner Joseph H. Canfield, Sr., Sweetwater Drive, Tucson, Ariz.

Operator Same as above, when in operation.

Principal Minerals Rhyolite rock, used as building material.

Number of men employed Quarry operated intermittently by sons of Mr. Canfield.

Production Rate Varies according to conditions and needs.

Topography Fairly flat---on east side of Tucson Mts.

Marketing Facilities Rhyolite rock used for building materials in vicinity of Tucson.

Uses Rhyolite rock quarried is used for building construction---building blocks, fireplaces, barbecues, and as flagstone for walks. It could also be used as an aggregate in concrete work.

Operations Operated intermittently according to demands. Mining equipment consists of air compressor, tracks and cars. Building blocks have to be cut to proper shape and size by chisels.

Prices \$3.00 a sq. ft. face for building blocks. \$1.50 per sq. ft. for flat work--for terraces, floors, walks, etc.

Proposed Plans No definite plans.
