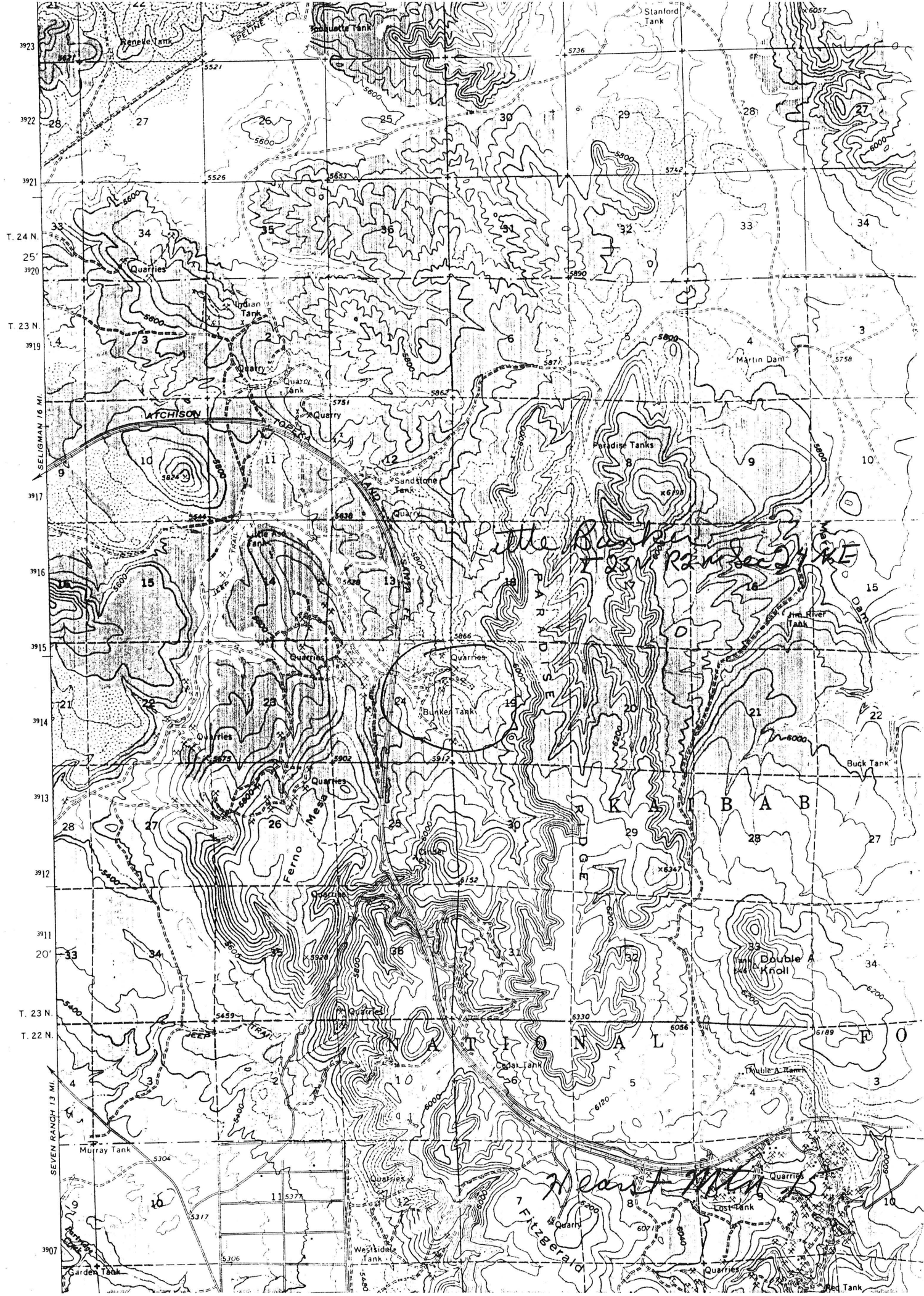



Western States Stone produces flagstone from these unpatented claims using small crews of between 2-4 men. The quarry men are typically mexicans working in the United States with green cards. They are paid based upon their production, but they must produce enough to earn minimum wage.

The quarry operation proceeds as follows: the soil and aluvium is removed. Holes are drilled and shot down natural joints in the sandstone. Enough explosive is used to "bump" a block free to work on. Then using double jacks and wedges the sandstone is split parallel to bedding planes into the desired thickness and loaded onto skids to be hauled to the Ashford Stoneyark W.S.S. (f) to be processed. Averaging value of a skid of flagstone at the quarry is \$50.00.
