



W. A. Hooton, Old Pueblo Club, Tucson, took over operation of this property from *✓* Coronado Copper Zinc Co., on a royalty basis, relinquishing his interest in the remainder of the properties of the original lease for a cash consideration. *✓* Nick Duyn has purchased a 20% interest in the Mammoth lease for \$4000, and is on the property. *✓* Barney Gibbons is mine super.

Hooton has used approximately \$7000 of a \$15,000 RFC loan in rehabilitating the mine. It is well equipped and he is breaking ore on the 200' level and hoisting to 300 ton bin. Has considerable ore broken - about 1000 tons. Has just completed a contract with Potter of Eagle-Picher which pays him about 50% of ore grading \$10 up to 75% at \$32. He mines it and puts it in bin, Eagle-Picher comes and gets it. The ore on 200 is running about 4% Cu and 8% Zn, approximately the same as ore he shipped from this mine in 1942. Coronado drilling has indicated a large reserve of ore down to 600' level of this incline shaft.

Hooton is again anxious to get into combat flying and believes he has it this time. He will turn over his equity-as is-to an operator. Wants about \$5000 cash and other terms to suit operator. There are one or two looking into it.

It sums up to one of those things where a taker must get his money out of the deal by August 1945 when his lease expires, meanwhile making payments to RFC and royalty to Coronado of 10% net. Since ore can be held at about \$15 of which operator gets nearly \$9 fob mine and no limit to tonnage above contract 50 tons, it might be done. Difficulty now is keeping a second shift working, and this must be done in order to make tonnage. Has 10 men at present and needs about 6 more.

In above milling deal, Eagle-Picher assumes all premiums of which there are B on zinc and two small advances on copper making gross of 21.2. In other words, deal is on gross recoverable value.



Rec'd the memo on Mammoth just as I was leaving for Nogales. This Mammoth mine is part of the Republic Mammoth group in Johnson camp. By the terms of Houston's deal with Mudd & Seaman, he was obliged to take the Mammoth back & operate it. You will recall that during his previous operation he shipped a hundred or so cars most of which was from the Republic, but there were a dozen or so cars from the Mammoth. Mammoth ore has less zinc than Republic and is of higher copper grade. The mine is about a mile or so north of the Republic - incline shaft but not much lateral work of recent date. It was open only about 200 feet when I was in it and it appeared that there were considerably old workings unaccessibly at that time. It has been a big producer along with Republic. Just got the assays on Collins mine today & will write it up on my

return.



SUBJECT: Hooton, Mammoth RFC loan

This is a good example of how a fellow can spoil his own case.

RFC did exactly what he asked.... to get an immediate yes or not approved... so they sent the case right to the Board and, of course in view of the missing information on leases, etc., and the complex title and lease situation, the Board turned it down flat.

I don't want you to say anything to Hooton about it as I don't know whether they will decide to let him know in the usual way, to take the wind out of his sails or not, or whether they will relent and lay it on the shelf awaiting the information asked for.

Anyway, it is always a little harder to deal with something the Board has once rejected.

But we will be able to get the case ~~reopened~~ reopened when the proper data arrives and a reconsideration.

If he gets the notification, you can say that you believe we can have the case reconsidered if he will just do what he is asked. Frank Kuehl seems to think the legal end might be straightened out. It is the engineering section... always much harder to handle, that Hooton has insulted.

But be careful with anyone as impulsive as he is or he will probably wire RFC just what I have told you if you inform him, and get me in Dutch also.

I am enclosing a copy of the wire sent by Hooton to Bill Broadgate, also a confidential memo sent to Charlie by Bill Broadgate.

Apparently Hooton wants to get things done but does not do them along proper lines and then cusses somebody out because he does not get results. I know this occurred on the Republic because his property was one that it it was properly presented and properly prepared, he should have been able to get in a mill. Hooton simply did not do his part in presentation of it and as a result a good play was muffed.

In the fourth paragraph of Bill Broadgate's memo to Charlie please note: "the leases and titles apparently are complicated and fouled up and some data is missing so that RFC can't do anything until he furnishes the information asked for."

You will have to use your discretion in handling Bill Hooton on this but I would suggest that you ask to see the correspondence wherein he was asked to furnish additional information and if he does not do it you can tell him that his chances are slim of getting RFC help even though he may know Don Rait and others very well and even though he does not hesitate to call a man such as W. D. Mark, who is evidently in position of some authority, a "half wit" in a public telegram.

Hooton should be made to realize he cannot be rough and expect to get gentle treatment himself. I think the trouble is with Hooton and not with the Washington end.

I have received the following memorandum from Bill Broadgate:

"Had a wire tonight from Hooton stating he has had a loan pending at RFC for 8 weeks but he does not give any details except it is for copper at the Mammoth Mine. He says he can make it pay at 12¢ copper."
