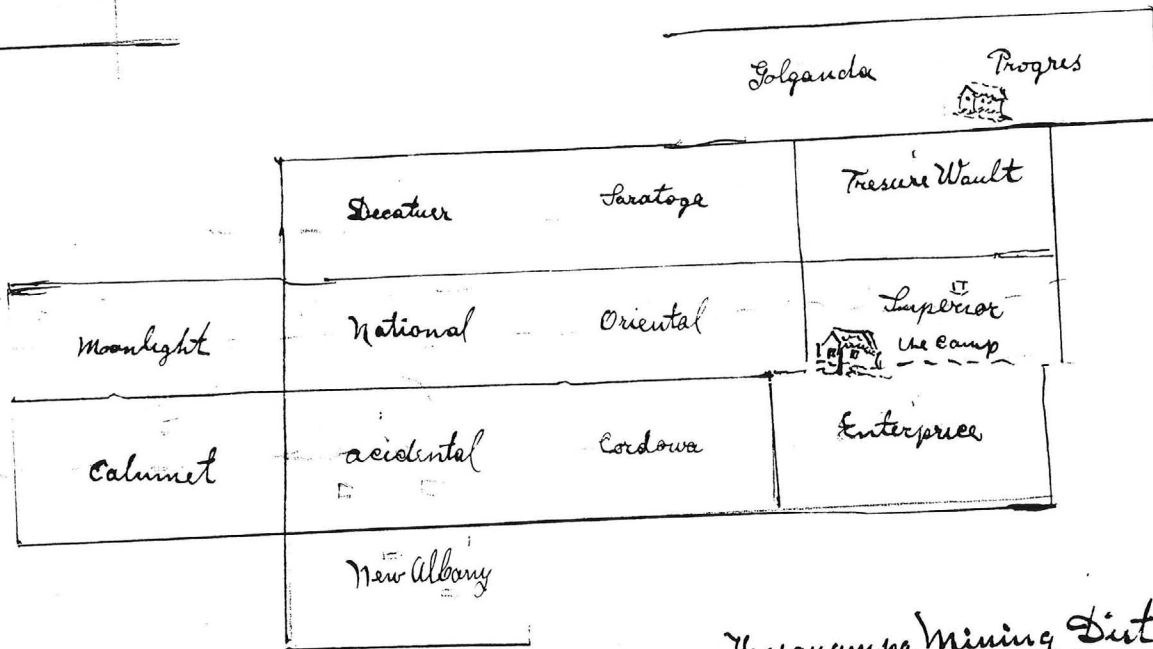
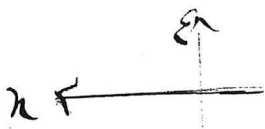

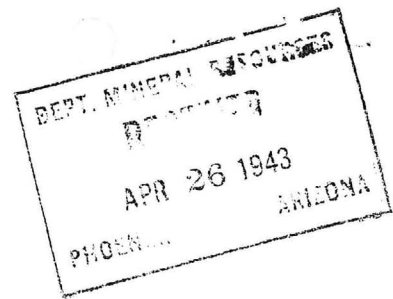

MEMORANDUM

To: Earl F. Hastings
From: Elgin B. Holt

I am herewith inclosing my report on the MATCHLESS GROUP OF MINES, located in the Bradshaw Mountains, around 16 miles southeast of Prescott. This property is owned by Mrs. M. K. Parish, P. O. Box 938, Prescott, Arizona.

I made a trip to this property with Mrs. Parish on April 22nd. While she has very little assay data regarding it, the property has real merit, in that it is located on a mineralized zone running for several miles in length, between Walker and the old Senator mine. A number of mines have been worked along this zone, in the old days, mainly for gold and silver ores. When zinc and lead came in at shallow depth, these metals were a hindrance to making money, instead of being an asset, as would be the case now.

In short, Mrs. Parish has drawn an application, with some assistance from myself, to RFC for a \$5,000 preliminary development loan. I recommend strongly that this loan be granted, notwithstanding the lack of assay data concerning this property. Hence, when this application reaches your desk, I request that you give it due consideration, taking into account such facts as you may have available concerning the other mines surrounding this property.

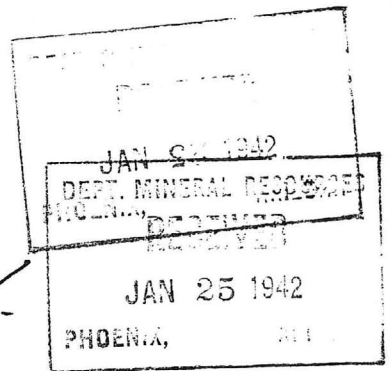

OWNER: Mrs. M. K. Parish, P. O. Box 938, Prescott, Ariz.

METALS: Zinc, lead, gold and silver.

LOCATION: Property is located 14 miles southeast of Prescott and two miles north of the Senator highway. It is reached by following the said highway 14 miles southeast from Prescott; thence one follows a narrow, but passable, road two miles north to property. Elevation at mine buildings is about 7,000 feet above sea level. Also, the mine is located on the headwaters of the Hassayampa River, in the Bradshaw Mountains, which are covered with a heavy growth of pine timber. There is ample water at property for heavy milling operations.

EXAMINATION: On April 22, 1943, I visited this property in company with the owner thereof, Mrs. Parish, who is arranging to file an application for an RFC loan in the sum of \$5,000.

GEOLOGY - VEINS: The surrounding country rocks consist of granodiorite, which has been intruded by later igneous dikes. This group of mining claims covers a portion of a huge mineralized zone running from Walker on the northeast to the Senator mine on the southwest. The said mineralized zone is made up of numerous quartz fissure veins. On this important mineral belt are located the following mines: Sheldon, Mud Hole, Golden Fleece, Money Metals, Chase, Storm Cloud, Senator and scores of other mines and prospects. Complex zinc sulphide ores occur at shallow depth, often within a few feet of surface outcrops. The Mud Hole mine was stoped to a depth of 700 feet; mill heads averaging \$6.50 in gold and silver, with goodly zinc-lead values. Ore shipments from the Golden Fleece mine averaged about \$14.00 gold and around 3.0 ounces silver per ton, plus 7.0% zinc, with some lead and copper; ores of this property being complex sulphide material. The grade and character of ore along this entire mineralized zone are very much the same.

AREA: The Matchless group consists of 14 unpatented claims.

NOTE: The Chase mine, adjoining the Matchless group on the northwest, is now being operated by J. Andrew West, of Prescott; operating funds being supplied by RFC. The Chase property covers a series of veins which seem to parallel the veins of the Matchless group. Ores of these two mines are similar, as is the case in all that region.


MINE WORKINGS: Mrs. Parish informed me that within this group are around 400 workings, consisting of, open cuts, test pits, tunnels and numerous shafts. The Enterprise Shaft, sunk on the vein which runs through the Enterprise, Oriental and Saratoga claims, to a depth of 50 feet, has been retimbered in recent years. Also the Golgonda shaft, which has been sunk to a depth of 32 feet on the Golgonda vein, has also been retimbered. Both of these shafts, however, are full of water, which could be baled out at a cost of around \$500.

On the Oriental and Saratoga claims, the vein above mentioned, is 3.5 feet in width, and has been developed by a 100-foot shaft sunk on vein. This shaft was sunk years ago. Hence, it is caved in and full of water. It would cost around \$2,000 to clean out, timber and unwater this shaft. As the property is covered by a heavy growth of pine timber, the cost of cutting and preparing mine timbers from this source would not be great. An open cut has been driven on this vein at a point about 150 feet southwest of the Saratoga shaft, just mentioned. In the face of this open cut is a quartz vein, around 3.5 feet wide, with bands of Sphalerite. Also, Mrs. Parish states that in the bottom of said cut an 8-foot prospect hole was sunk on vein and that in the bottom of this hole about two feet of solid zinc sulphide ore was encountered.

PRODUCTION: During the early days, so I was informed, considerable surface ore was shipped assaying from \$40.00 to \$120.00 in gold and silver per ton. No records of these shipments are now available.

WORK RECOMMENDED: As the mine is not now in shape for sampling, I recommend that the following work should be carried out:

Unwater both the Enterprise and Golgonda shafts; clean out, re-timber and unwater the Saratoga shaft, as above set forth. Also a number of prospect holes and open cuts on the two main veins should be cleaned out, at slight expense, in order to uncover these veins for sampling. All this work could be carried out for around \$5,000. After this has been done and the property thoroughly sampled, and should said sampling prove satisfactory, I further recommend that steps should be taken to finance extensive exploratory work on property, with the prime end in view of opening up a large underground supply of complex ores, sufficient to supply a mill of goodly capacity. If all this can be carried out, I am confident the mine can be put on a paying basis. Mainly, however, such work should result in uncovering ores carrying zinc and lead; both of these metals being urgently needed in the war effort.

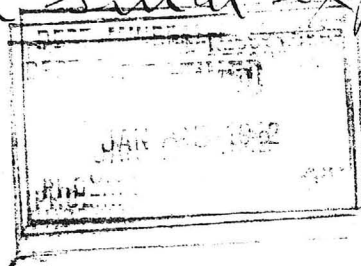

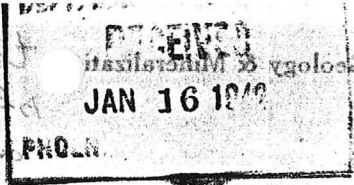
