Went to Mr. Franclin Maxwell's property about 5 miles northeast of Walker where about a 1000' of adit was examined. There is little mineralization except in a short drift at the bottom of a 20 ft. winze. Here high grade Pb-Ag is from 2"-8" wide and extends along the back for 7 or 8 ft. Mr. Maxwell inherited the property (4 unpatented claims) from his father, a building contractor who obviously spent considerable money on exploration & development with no financial return. Mr. Maxwell was advised to cut samples at designated places in the workings. The only previous samples taken by Mr. Maxwell was of the above mentioned high grade, which were doubtless specimen.

Franclin Maxwell's two daughters brought in 6 assays of samples taken in his prospect about 2 miles NE of Walker. Two of them were very high in Ag, but there was no indication as to location along the drift. The Forest Service has given him notice to remove his trailer house from the claims. GW WR 3/10/72

Mr. Franclin Maxwell, Phoenix, called to read a letter he had from the U.S. Forest Service regarding building a new road into his unpatented mining claims about 3 miles NE of Walker, Yavapai County. The letter stated that due to the recent forest fire burning the ground cover (he lost his trailer house) erosion would be increased. It was suggested he go to the Prescott Forest Service office and have one of their personnel accompany him to the property to mark the new route of the access road. This demand for a new road appears to be another method of discouraging the claimant. GW WR 7/24/7


