Work & Geology: The workings and geology are adequately described on pages 89-98, U. S. Bureau of Mines I.C. 7706 (1955) by L. A. Stewart. Mr. Wright stated that he had recently done considerable road work for assessment requirements, as well as driving some short adits into the asbestos bearing bed. He stated that about 6000 feet for asbestos bearing beds were now exposed. He also stated that he had had trouble with the Forest Service over grazing and water sources. This came about when he decided to fence his claims.

Interview with G. W. Wright

Mr. Wright has resolved his controversy with the Forest Service and retained all his rights but on two marginal claims. All of the retained claims have marketable asbestos showing and 6 have yielded large amounts of fiber. The bone of contention was that several claims have marketable timber that the Forest Service wanted.
