Lawerence F. Long 267 E Blacklidge Tucson, Arizona Termination of Proceedings under Section 5, of the Act of July 23, 1955

Stipulation Accepted Further Proceedings Terminated as to Designated Claims

May 5, t959, Lawrence F. Long, Claimant, on behalf of himself, and James M. Dale who owns one-half interest in the Triangle claim, filed in this office a verified statement in connection with mining claims designated as the Triangle and Grubstake, in compliance with a "Notice to Mining Claimants" published pursuant to Section 5 of the Act of July 23, 1955 (69 Stat. 367). The subject verified statement was acceptable and was transmitted to the Regional Forester, Albuquerque.

On February 29, 1960, Lawrence F. Long, through the U. S. Forest Service, filed the following stipulation withdrawing the said verified statement:

Pursuant to the provisions of section 5© of the Act of July 23, 1955 (69, Stat. 367), I LAWRENCE F.
