Mrs. S. E. Scott has recently organized and incorporated a company known as the Oatman Placers Co. for the purpose of developing and working placer ground adjoining her Oatman Queen lode property. Some Chicago people put up sufficient funds to drill and sample 10 holes 10' to 35' deep in the gravel and soil on these claims. Preliminary sampling gave assays of from \$1.40 to \$8.40 per ton. No information was available however as to what part of the gold value was placer (free) gold. A Mr. Don East of Las Vegas has apparently convinced these people of the superlative merits of his patented vacuum placer device for recovery of gold, and also h/e plans for a method of financing various mine operations. She believes that Mr. East's machine and his engineering and financing ability would be a boon for all small miners of the state if only somehow they were made aware of the fact. A meeting of the directors of the corporation is to be held on June 25 and at that time the results of further sampling and testing will be disclosed, and presumably plans will be laid for additional financing.

Interviewed Mrs. S. E. ✓ Scott, owner, at Oatman on 10-17-57. The following is as told by her:

The Oatman Queen ore runs \$18.00 in gold and 55¢ in silver. It has been followed down 120 feet and a Major Ellis has agreed with her that it can be open pitted.

The property is northwest of and near Oatman. Mrs. Scott has owned it since 1945 and her attempt to run it failed due to lack of funds. It has produced about \$60,000 in the past.

Mark Gemmill looked at it and wasn't too impressed. He suggested trying to sort and ship high silica gold ore for flux.

Eisenhower and Smith-Emery get thorium, nickel and cobalt in her ore. An A.E.C. man told her the thorium was in quantity sufficient to interest them. Mrs. Scott asked that a geiger counter be taken to her property the next time an engineer is there.

She said that Crotty was dealing with Brandenburg for Tom Reed tailings. He wants to put his machine in. She also mentioned a mill near Kingman ran by a Mr. Purcell (?) that was shipping 20 ton lots of gold-silver concentrates. I wasn't able to check this. She added that the Kingman Chamber of Commerce was trying to get someone to put in a custom mill.

Mrs. Scott is feeble and nearly blind. A man named Mullen looks after her property.






I have a matter that I want to take up with Mr. Johnson in person and if they held this Meeting I would like to know as my card states March 9th.


I have a matter that I want to take up with Mr. Johnson in person and if they held this Meeting I would like to know as my card states March 9th.


Dear Mr. Williams:
