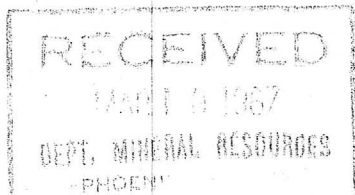

The principal minerals seem to be chrysocolla, azurite, and malachite. The host rock seems to be severely altered.

The claim also has a cave lined by selenite, a variety of gypsum, deep purple octahedral fluoroite crystals and minute cerussite, $PbCO_3$, crystals. This is suitable material for the mineral collectors. A few typical specimens were turned over to Lee Hammons.
