The Oversight Group of Claims.

Situated near the head of mill fork of Mineral Creek on the south slope of the Pinal range of mountains about 12 miles southerly from Globe, in Gila Co. Ariz.

The main two parallel veins which are about six hundred feet apart, (fissure veins cutting sericite schist -) paralleling a granite contact at a distance of about one half mile - from the granite.

The main values are gold-silver & tungsten (hubnerite) in what would be classed as sugar quartz, the gold values appear to be in the pyrite, and the silver in the form of argentite intimately associated with the tungsten, all apparently formed in the quartz at the same time. The veins proper are from three to four feet between smooth walls with the pay streak of high grade generally from eighteen inches to three feet wide along the hanging wall, the vein matter below the high grade is quartz and brecciated schist, carrying considerable pyrite with values in gold and silver but, no tungsten.

This vein system strikes north east, south west.

The dip varies near the surface at from 35° to 45° to the northwest. at 60 foot depth in the Oversight shaft the vein dips about 60°

The lenses of ore in this vein system vary in length of from six hundred feet to two thousand feet for a distance of over two miles. The difference in elevation of the surface showings is over two thousand feet

The Oversight shaft 65 ft. deep is at the S.W. end of the group and at an elevation of something like 5000. ft. the highest point on the veins is about 7000. ft. The ore showings are opened up in several places with ten ft shafts and open cuts.

with the exception of the oversight shaft and a short tunnel there has been no real development work done

There has been no ore shipped from this ground except three test mill runs of a few hundred pounds each. the last of which was four different samples of 500 lbs each taken from four different places on the upper vein.

assays taken along the croppings of these  
veins run from \$5.67 up to \$34.56 gold and silver  
and pass tungsten at nearly every point.  
average assays taken along the ore

the surface ore shows pyrites,  
but is usually somewhat oxidized.  
In normal years there is running water

## THE OVERSIGHT GROUP OF CLAIMS

The difference in elevation of the surface showings is over two thousand feet. The Oversight shaft, 65 feet deep, is at the southwest end of the group and at an elevation of something like 5,000 feet. The highest point on the veins is about 7,000 feet. The ore showings are opened up in several places with ten feet shafts and open cuts. With the exception of the Oversight shaft and a short tunnel there has been no real development work done.

Probably about 25 per cent gold-silver assays by Ross C. Finey, Globe. Tungsten assays by Colorado Assaying Co., Denver, Colorado. Assays taken along the croppings of these veins run from 5.67 up to \$34.56 gold and silver, and pans tungsten at nearly every point. Average assays taken along the ore showings usually runs around \$10.00 gold and silver--about 50-50 au.-ag. The surface ore shows pyrites, but is usually somewhat oxidized. In normal years there is running water in Mill Creek sufficient to operate a fifty-ton mill nine months of the year. The veins system parallels Mill Creek at about one thousand feet higher elevation.
