

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RRB WR 11/20/84: Mike Vehill, Securities Division, ACC 255-4242, called for information about Border Silver Properties as a courtesy for his counterpart in Washington state. Border Silver Properties is promoting a silver property in Cochise County. Mr. Vehill sent us a copy of the report and prospectus and it is for the Panther Claims (file) Cochise County. The report and prospectus were put in the file and a copy sent to Tucson.

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mg wr 11/8/85: With reference to the Ellsworth (Panther) property in Cochise County, I have learned that the Border Silver Ltd. Partnership was apparently not successful. Mr. Frankovich is now planning to go public and sell shares in order to raise exploration funds.


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Ellsworth property returned to owners after a Canadian company held the property doing geological, geophysical and other work. GWI AR 73-74

Earle Ellsworth 2204 - 15th St., Douglas, Arizona,  
Mr. Ellsworth came to the field engineer about the Panther Claims, located 10 miles east of Douglas, which he has held for 8 to 10 years (see Field Engineer's reports, Jan. 12, 1961 and previous).

Mr. Ellsworth stated that he now holds 16 Federal claims and 25 State claims, covered by State Leases.

Also Mr. Ellsworth stated that he gave an Option to purchase or lease to Robert Mulican of 9th Street, Douglas in Nov. 1964. This was a one year option, in which Mr. Mulican is obligated to do \$5,000 worth of work. To date none of this work has been done.

Mr. Ellsworth also reported having considerable difficulty with the State Land Dept. in reg to mineral leases. The State Land Dept. unjustly claims that the mining claims are not monumented correctly, that Mr. Ellsworth is late in reporting discovery work, etc. Mr. Ellsworth stated that he will, again, write to Frank P. Knight, Director of the Dept. of Mineral Resources, as he received such excellent action the last time he sought help from him in regard to some actions by the State Land Dept.

Recent Exploration: At Mr. Ellsworth's request, the field engineer examined a new area, on which Mr. Ellsworth had done some exploration work during the past month. Six shallow open cuts, about 6 ft. x 6 ft. x 2 to 4 ft. deep had been dug in an area roughly 50 ft. long and 20 ft. wide. These open cuts all showed galena and anglesite, with a small amount of cerussite disseminated throughout a shale country rock. Mr. Ellsworth reported that he had taken two samples of these cuts which ran about 22% lead and 12 oz. of silver. Mr. Ellsworth also stated that he believes this deposit will average about 10% lead and 7 oz. of silver. Field engineer recommended additional exploration work to determine the lateral area and the depth of this deposit.

At Mr. Earle Ellsworth's request of July 26 and your verification of this date, this letter will outline the results and opinions gained during my visit to Mr. Ellsworth's Ash Creek property. This visit, made on June 25, 1960, was of one day's duration and was a reconnaissance of the ground. No samples for assay were taken nor was any verification of property status made.

Mr. Ellsworth's claims cover over two square miles of federal and state land adjoining the International Boundary in Cochise County, lying principally in but not restricted to, sections 16 and 17 of T. 24 S., R. 29 E. They are some 10 miles due East of Douglas. The topography is hilly with relief of around 500 feet. Climate and vegetation are typical of the Sonoran desert. Jeep roads, in fair condition, at the time of the examination, provide access to the claims. The road from Douglas is two lane and graded.

Two principal rock groups are present. Oldest of these are the limestone and elastic sediments of the Bisbee Group (Cretaceous). These older rocks have been intruded by fine-grained, thick porphyry dikes or sills ranging in composition from monzonite to andesite. Contacts between the two groups are sharp and stand out upon inspection by their color contrast. The exposures of these igneous rocks are irregular in plan and indicate highly variable strike. Megascopic alteration of the igneous rocks is not intense but one has weathered to a seal brown color, suggestive of oxidized pyrite. No pyrite was observed. Only slight and localized alteration of the sediments at the igneous contact has taken place. This appears to be mostly baking with some sparse development of epidote.

Principal mineralization in the area is galena and its oxidized products and these are minor, although locally impressive, amounts of primary and secondary copper minerals. It is my understanding that some silver has been mined from the district, and if such is the case, there is the added possibility of the presence of the metal in the Ellsworth claims.

It is difficult to assess the amount of lead mineralization present since the various lead minerals are widely spread in the area. There does not seem to be a definitive mineralization zone but rather a mineralized area consisting of a number of prospected and developed shows. In general the lead mineralization occurs in faulted and fractured limestone and appears to increase in abundance in the rocks closer to igneous contacts. The small amount of copper mineralization is fracture associated and erratically distributed.

Most of the mineral shows have been developed by shallow cuts and pits and several by more extensive work such as deep cuts and a shaft. The ore shaft seen at the time of examination was inaccessible. This shaft, near a contact between dike and limestone appeared to be about 100 feet deep and had a moderate sized dump. Material on the dump indicates that some lead and minor copper may have been present in the workings.

None of the work done so far on the claims has blocked out any positive tonnage of ore but, instead, has opened the many shows of mineralization. In its present state, the property is only a semi-developed prospect but in my opinion a very attractive prospect upon which further exploratory and development work is well justified. This opinion is based upon the following factors:

1. The almost ubiquitous presence of lead mineralization in sedimentary rocks of the area. There are, of course, unmineralized zones in the sediments but nevertheless the widespread distribution of even the small shows is encouraging. The large hill near the center of the area appears to be intensely mineralized although, at first glance, the mineralization (cerussite and anglesite) is not apparent.

2. An attractive and encouraging relation of igneous rocks to mineralization. Whether or not this relation will be important in the subsurface is difficult to tell but the close relations at the surface between dike and mineralization indicate that a favorable outlook could be taken on testing this relationship at depth.

3. Strong similarity of surface indications (alteration and fracturing) of this property with similar producing lead properties in other parts of southern Arizona.

4. Amenability of the mineralization here to relatively unexpensive concentration methods.

Presence of primary copper minerals is interesting and deserve further consideration and testing. It is not possible to evaluate shows of this metal but further development and exploration should give some answer.

In closing, I would like to restate that I believe this property to be an extremely promising prospect for further exploratory and development work and has sufficient potential to make a modest amount of such work well justified.

Principal Minerals Lead & Silver with a trace of Gold & a very small amount of copper.

Present Mining Activity Exploration work by owner.

Geology & Mineralization Veins and small replacement deposits in limestone rock. A large number of veins, from a few inches to over 2 ft. in width outcrop on the property. Veins appear to be almost vertical. In addition to this, a number of small ore lenses are found outcropping on the surface, containing from 1 to 5 tons of ore each. The limestone rock between the ore veins and ore lenses appear to contain a small quantity of ore in spots, but no general sampling program has been conducted to determine just how much the country rock would run in ore values. Veins are from about 10 ft. up to 50 ft. apart. Some chert is found, and also a considerable amount of barite is found in certain spots on the property.

Ore Values Mr. Ellsworth reports samples taken on some of the ore veins and ore lenses, which have run from 9 to 27 % Lead, with from 9 to 16 oz. silver. He reports that he has sold 10 tons of ore to the Minerals Reserve, Brophy Bldg., Douglas, and that he has 1 to 2 carloads of ore ready to be shipped. This ore he estimates will run about 15 % in lead, (as it has been handpicked), with an estimate of 9 oz. in silver. He estimates that he could mine ore by selective mining, without handpicking, and get from 7 to 8 % Lead. I would regard this estimate rather high, judging by the lean character of the ore and the fact that the ore veins are very narrow and hard to separate from the waste material. I would regard direct shipments to the smelter to be uneconomical for this reason.

Ore in Sight & Probable None. Will need exploration work to show up ore reserves.

Milling & Marketing Facilities No mill on the property. Property would require a mill, if exploration work shows a sufficient tonnage and grade of ore to justify the expenditure. A well with 8 in. casing and 240 ft. deep on the property (water 70' below c.

Past History & Production

(1) French Mine, located on one of the claims, was last operated in 1921. Ore was hoisted through a 300 ft. vertical shaft, and then run through a small mill on the property. Shaft is now bulkheaded off 10 ft. below the collar. Ore is reported to be high in silver values, but there is no records of production or ore values.

(2) Earle Ellsworth located claims in the summer of 1956, and has done considerable exploration work on the property: viz. (a) Trench 10' wide, 50' long x 6 to 10 ft. deep, (b) Trench 12' wide, 50' long x 6 to 25 ft. deep, (c) Open cut 50' x 50' (d) Trench 6' wide, 60' long x 4' deep, (e) 12 or more smaller open cuts. About 100 tons of ore was removed from trench b.

Proposed Plans Mr. Ellsworth would like to sell or lease his property to some large company, who would have enough capital to explore the property by means of diamond drilling, and develop same for a large scale open pit mining operation, with a mill for milling the ore
