



Work at the plant and mines continued at a constant pace during the past two months. Some Phillips asbestos was treated in addition to the company ores. The liquidation of the partially milled Phillip's ore is under the supervision of L.A. Stewart, formerly with the Bureau of Mines. The Valley Bank of Globe is the receiver for the Phillips Estate. Most of the Phillips fiber contains 15 to 18 per cent of serpentine rock and the rock content is being reduced to under 2 per cent at the Town Mill (formerly La Tourneau Mill). (See Town report.) The fiber ranges from 4 to 2 grades, much being a good four grade.

Stansbury Mine. This property, which is known also as the KM Lease, consists of 2 claims situated about 15 miles east of the Salt River Bridge approximately in Secs. 29 and 30, T. 5 N., R. 19 E. The deposit was first located in 1923 (Mineral Survey 3849) by E. D. Reidhead as the Apache Nos. 1 and 2. (See Plate 3.) No work was done on the property, however, until 1951, when a lease was secured by Stansbury, R. Reidhead, and O'Dell. Mining was begun in 1953 by the Arizona Asbestos Mining Company, and by 1955, the ore zone was developed by 2 open cuts, 2 shallow inclined shafts, and 2 adits. In 1958, the property was mined for a short period by the Phillips Asbestos Company and for a short period in 1966 by Western Asbestos Mfg. Corp. Total production from 1953 through 1966 has been approximately 340 tons of crude ore.

The deposit is on a point of land formed by a sharp bend in Salt River. The stratigraphic sequence on the point consists of 50 feet of Dripping Spring Quartzite at the base, overlain by 75 feet of Mescal Limestone, which in turn is overlain by 75 feet of diabase. Devonian Martin Limestone rests unconformably on the diabase.

Numerous asbestos veins occur in a zone from 25 to 30 feet below the diabase and appear more or less continuously along the northern side of the point over a length of nearly 2,500 feet. Along this extent, the attitude of the limestone is quite constant, the strike varying between N. 20° to 30°E. and dipping from 20° to 30°SE.

Interviewed Rex Town, 450 E. Mesquite, Globe, at his mill. He is now mining the Phillips mine for Mrs. Guy Phillips and milling the asbestos in his mill. The Guy Phillips estate has been settled and his wife has the mine. There are four men working at the mine and two in the mill. EGW WR 1-29-65

Rex Town, superintendent for Western Asbestos Mfg. Co., P.O. Box 11496, Phoenix, who are mining Phillips mine. Mr. Al Lamm is general manager and D. Hayes, Phoenix office manager. Other officers of company not known or revealed. FTJ WR 11-26-65

Visited Western Asbestos plant. Dan Hayes, office mgr., said mine and mill operating two shifts per day. FTJ WR 1-28-66



Owner and Operator-Guy Phillips

Phillips Mines, Gila County, near Globe, Arizona.

At the time of the visit, there were only 10 men working instead of the customary ~~40~~ 40 men. Mr. Phillips was in a discouraged mood and said that he was figuring on going out of business. He has apparently had difficulties with the tax men and according to rumors his fiber is nearly all short at the present.

It should be pointed out that Mr. Phillips is a man given to moods and may well have been in a mood at the time of visit. He has a long record of successful operation in the asbestos business in this area and at the present group of mines.

It should be further pointed out that the rumors in the asbestos business are very frequently in error and are very unreliable.

Phillips Mines has a well equipped group of dwellings for his labor, a mill, ample mine equipment etc. and a market for his fiber, which he has continued to maintain, not having shipped any fiber to the warehouse program or the national stockpile.
