Subject: Information on operations

The Picacho group of 36 patented mining claims is located on the east side of the Sells-Ajo highway across from the Picacho trading post, 74 miles west of Tucson. It is owned by 0.W Muish of Sells, at present operator of the trading post. The mine was a silver-lead producer, reportedly, in the latter part of the 19th century, but apparently no records of shipments are available. It is reported that the highly siliceous ore was in demand at that time for smelter flux. Mr Huish Dought for Takel in 1947.

No examination of the property was made at this time, owing to the absence of the engineer in charge, but the following information was furnished by Mr. Huish.

A group consisting of seven Los Angeles business men has taken a lease on the property, presumably on a royalty basis, to develop and to ship a siliceous silver ore. A meeting of all principals was scheduled in Tucson, Feb. 19, to determine future policies and operations of the company, which currently is known as the Picacho Mines Inc., incorporated in California and Arizona. M. W. Redhead, Sells, is resident engineer. Mr. Redhead was not present on the property at the time of visit.

Mr. Huish stated that the company is prepared to develop the property, on which is a 600 foot shaft and numerous shallower workings. At present four men are employed, the crew to be increased to 25 men in the near future. It has been planned to build a small mill to beneficiate these ores so that shipments may proceed at once, planning on increasing production to furnish the proposed As jo smelter with a suitable product later.

The company has also made arrangements to acquire the <u>Cunquien</u> group of one patented and 9 unpatented claims. This group lies to the west of the highway and is owned by Maurice Hedderman of Tucson, et al. This group, a gold-silver-lead producer, has been reported on by Miles Carpenter and others, and some of these reports are available in the office of the Department of Mineral Resources. No recent examinations have been made since that of Hubert d'Autremont of Tucson who at one time was interested in the property. This report can be obtained from Maurace d'Autremont of Tucson.
