

MARICOPA COUNTY

NJN WR 8/9/85: Hilton Cass, Geologist with the Forest Service Zone Office reported that he visited the Rattler Millsite operated by American International Mining and Milling (f). It is located at T7N R9E Sec 19 NE, Maricopa County. This is probably the same site as the Rattlesnake Mill (f) which was a mercury retort mill. The Rattlesnake Mill (f) is not listed in Maricopa County MILS but should be added. Presently the site contains a 50 TPD ball mill, bank of flotation mills and various vats, tanks, conveyors and other mill equipment plus a camp to house the laborers. Mr. Duncan of American International Mining and Milling has proposed to do some open pit mining from the Sunflower Group (f) Maricopa County and process it at the mills.

KAP WR 8/29/86: A visit was made to the Rattlesnake millsite, site of the American International Mining and Milling Corporation's (file) mill in Maricopa County. Only a caretaker was around and he did not speak English. There are two or three dwellings on the property which appear to be currently in use. The mill appeared (we were not allowed near the equipment) to have not been used for a number of months or longer, but otherwise appeared in good repair. A number of storage tanks labeled sulfuric acid were noted.

RRB WR 8/28/87: Visited the Rattler Mill which showed no evidence of recent use although someone appears to be living there.

SUBJECT: American International Mining and Milling Corporation

Mr. James G. Duncan reported his firm, American International Mining and Milling Corporation, P.O. Box 308, Payson, Arizona 85541 (206 South Bee-line), (he is president), is active in the Sunflower District, Maricopa County.

He further reported their mine and mill can recover mercury, antimony, silver as bromides and iodides, gold, iridium and ruthenium from ores at their mines. Verification of shipments or sales were not provided. Archy Porch is their refiner.

Mr. Duncan went on to report that the mill runs intermittently. During the last year (1979) he said the mill consisted of a 4' X 5' ball mill, gravity jig, Wilfrey table, 8 cell Denver Sub-A flotation unit, agitation leach tanks, heat exchangers, 4 counter current decantation units, and a 20,000 gallon tank. Water is obtained from a 500 foot well approximately one mile from the property. He also has a 300 pound and a 500 pound "Tope" furnace.

He stated his property position consists of the Cornicopia Group, the Sunnyside Group or Mine, the Onieda Mine, the Red Rock Mine or Group, and 6500 acres of claims held as the Sunflower Group.

Conference with Gordon Grimes and visit

Grimes stated that he was selling the plant to Don Turnbull et al, of Cain Springs Milling and Mining Co., Payson, General Delivery. So far they have treated 73 tons of Ord dump material for H. C. Smith, Globe, and close to 200 tons of gob and sluff material from inside the Rattlesnake Tunnel for Alex Anderson and Wm. Hunter. Firing, at present, is done with diesel fuel and the Gould Furnace is run at 750-800 degrees F. The feed is crushed to minus 1-inch (some long, narrow schist fragments were nearly 2 inches long, however). Grimes said that their calculated extraction is between 85-90 percent. The heads from the Ord dump ran 2½ pounds Hg to the ton and the tailings slightly over 2 percent Hg. The ore from the Rattlesnake had less grade and failed to extract as well as the Ord material. Conference with Tony Bennett

A week ago two miners were killed by lethal gases in the bottom of the Cypress 35-ft. shaft. Two others who attempted to rescue them were also affected, one seriously. At no time was the shaft blown out by air prior to the accident and after blasting the day before. This could pose a serious suit threat due to careless supervision. It was variously reported that the compressor was not functioning properly but this is unproven. The Coroners jury convened 6-28-66 and rendered a verdict which stated that the men were killed by a lethal gas or gases which largely resulted from blasting. As a result of this the Cypress Mine and Rattlesnake Mill were closed by court order, pending a verdict from the Coroners jury. Memo LAS 6-28-66

Interview with Gordon Grimes, 10-4-61.

The mill has been idle most of September but 4 truck loads of ore have been stored at the mill bin for a run early in October. This ore came from the lower tunnel at Pine Mountain. It consists of soapy-feeling sericite, stained red by cinnibar and contains some native mercury which comes out as minute spheres in the pan. Mr. Grimes estimated that this ore will average around 8-10 pounds to the ton. During August two mill runs yielded 12 flasks of quicksilver.

Mr. Grimes was repairing the mill in anticipation that he can lease it to other operators in the area. He now has withdrawn from the mining end because of his poor physical condition. He also stated that he had heard that C.O. Johnson had a chance to refinance the Ord-Bluebird operation. Johnson apparently made overtures relative to leasing the mill in the event that he can refinance. The mill needs a new firing system for the retort and the crusher jaws need relining. The silicified and hard quartz impregnated schist is very abrasive. Grimes feels that he should install an air jet with the oil feeder that produces the flame for the retort. He has been unable to get the 1500 degrees F he wants throughout the length of the retort. On occasions the oil feed, now present, has not completely ignited and the film of oil left on the ore has absorbed the mercury "flower," and caused losses in the tailings. (Tom Bolich is having similar difficulties at the National, according to C.O. Carlson and James McFarland.)

Subject: Conference with Oliver Grimes at Rattlesnake mill

Mr. Grimes reported that the tunnel being driven to intercept the quicksilver bearing vein (or lense) exposed in a deep cut, had encountered good ore. The material is very similar to that previously uncovered by the cut. Another adit will be driven 75-80 feet deeper to intercept the same lense. The ore here consists of a very thin laminae type of sericite schist which has been impregnated by cinnabar on the laminae planes. This ore, according to Grimes, treats quite satisfactorily in the retort, yielding about 86 percent of the mercury content. The mill was run for 6 days and the mine for 20 days during January. The best run was during September 1960, when 180 tons of ore yielded 26 flasks of mercury. The ore being mined at present ran approximately 6-7 pounds per ton. However, the newly exposed ore in the adit runs about 10 pounds. Some ore is also being extracted from the older Pine Mountain workings. 5 men are now working at the mine, and 2 at the furnace. (These are part time employees.) The road to Pine Mountain has been partly surfaced.

Subject: Mill Visit (supplementary)

The mill is now handling 25 tons per day of ore averaging 6-7 pounds per ton, which is yielding 1 flask of quicksilver per day. The substitution of smaller openings in the burner and increased size of the condensation chambers has eliminated the former trouble. With the discarded burner, where the openings were much larger, some of the oil failed to burn and sprayed over the charge. This oil floated off the quicksilver as "flower" and caused a severe loss. With the new burner the flame is more evenly dispersed over the charge and is projected further along the retort cylinder. The present extraction is well over 80% whereas it was less than 40% previously.

The ore being treated is largely composed of impregnated schist and accompanying quartz stringers. Some bands run up to 17% but these are furnishing a relatively small proportion of the head. Crushing to -1 inch is now being done, but Brunson feels that better extraction could be obtained by crushing to $-\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

Rattlesnake Group

The Rattlesnake group, inactive when visited in 1960, lies along Bush Highway at the head of Slate Creek and adjoins the Ord group on the west. It consists of eight claims.

The Rattlesnake plant is a 35-ton Gould rotary furnace, leased from Robert McGhee by William Brunson and Gordon Grimes.

The plant, presently inactive, occasionally is run for short periods and treats most of the ore mined in the area.

Dome Rock Mountains District Mines and Properties

The Dome Rock Mountains, in northern Yuma County, 10 miles east of the Colorado River, are bounded on the west by the Colorado River valley and on the east by the Tyson Wash valley. The range trends north-south and attains an altitude of 3,000 feet.

The deposits lie in the central part of the range about 10 air miles south of Quartzite. They may be reached by traveling south on State Route 95 for 12 miles, then west on an unimproved road for 4 miles, and 8 miles north-west to the claims. The last 8 miles, virtually a "Jeep trail," may be impassable.

The deposits are in a rugged area flanked by highly serrated spurs separated by deep canyons which extend in an east-west direction. The canyons have intermittent streams subject to flash floods during the torrential down-pours common to this area.

The area has very hot summers and mild winters. The summer thunder showers account for most of the meager precipitation, but a little snow falls on the higher mountains during the winter. The sparse vegetation consist mostly of cactus and a few thorny bushes.

The part of the Dome Rock Mountains containing the mercury deposits is composed predominantly of sericitic, quartzitic, conglomeratic, and chloritic schists. The cinnabar vein, in a fault in the schist, consists mostly of brecciated quartz with cinnabar disseminated throughout. The oxidized state of the deposit suggests that some of the cinnabar may have been derived from mercurial tetrahedrite.

Cinnabar Group

The Cinnabar group consists of five claims, patented in 1904, and in 1960 was operated by Dean Aglietti of Reno, Nev. The operator was building a road to provide easier access to the property. No other work was being done.

The last reported mercury production was in 1914; there have been several unsuccessful attempts to operate since then.






